
Fireworks during the Fourth of July are as American as apple-pie, but did you know that two out of five fires reported on that day are started by fireworks, more than for any other cause? The good news is you can enjoy your holiday and the fireworks, with just a few simple safety tips:

PROCEED WITH CAUTION!

- » Leave fireworks to the professionals. Do not use consumer fireworks.
- » The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend a public display conducted by trained professionals.
- » After the firework display, children should never pick up fireworks that may be left over, they may still be active.

CONSUMER FIREWORKS

include sparklers and firecrackers. The tip of a sparkler burns at a temperature of more than **1,200 degrees Fahrenheit**, which is hot enough to cause third-degree burns.



FACTS

- ! Each July Fourth, thousands of people, often children and teens, are injured while using consumer fireworks.
- ! The risk of fireworks injury is highest for children ages 5–19 and adults 25–44.
- ! Nearly 90% of emergency room fireworks injuries involve fireworks consumers are permitted to use.





Police Chief Brandt attends Senior Management Institute for Police

The Senior Management Institute for Police (SMIP) is a program of the Police Executive Research Forum that provides senior police executives with intensive training in the latest management concepts and practices used in business and government, as well as discussions of the most challenging issues facing law enforcement executives today. A demanding three-week course, SMIP brings together a faculty from top universities, successful law enforcement chief executives, and subject matter experts from the private sector. It is designed for mid-to upper-level police executives who ultimately will lead police agencies throughout the United States and other participating countries. SMIP's curriculum addresses the issues that demand the attention of today's forward-thinking law enforcement leaders. We are proud of the commitment shown by Chief Brandt's participation in this prestigious program.

Citizens Police Academy

The Evans Police Department will be hosting a 2016 Citizens Police Academy (CPA). The 8 week academy will begin on August 9, 2016 with classes held on Tuesday evenings from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

The Citizens Police Academy promotes community partnerships and is designed to familiarize Evans' citizens with the day-to-day operations of their police department.

Participants will attend lectures and discussions on topics to include: crime scene investigations, traffic enforcement, accident investigation, gangs, SWAT, crisis negotiations, narcotics, use of force, less lethal force, and internal affairs.

The program is free of charge, but seating is limited to 25. You must be at least 18 years of age and a member of the Evans' community either as a resident, employed, or property owner. A background check will be completed on applicants prior to acceptance. National Night Out

National Night Out is a crime and drug prevention event that is sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch and co-sponsored locally by the Evans Police Department.

This year is the 33rd anniversary of this event with over 38 million people across the country expected to participate.

National Night Out is designed to:

- Heighten crime and drug prevention awareness.
- Generate support for, and participation in, local anti-crime efforts.
- Strengthen neighborhood spirit and police/community partnerships.
- Send a message to criminals letting them know neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.

Participating neighborhoods nationwide are asked to turn on outside lights and spend the evening outside with neighbors, citizens, and police. Neighborhoods will be hosting a variety of events ranging from small potlucks and barbecues to large block parties and business-after-hour events. Some additional event ideas include, but are not limited to, ice cream socials, games, contests, discussing neighborhood issues, setting neighborhood goals, beautifying a common area, discussing or planning a Neighborhood Watch Program. 


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


Wastewater Rate Adjustment and Timeline

Groundbreaking for the new Evans Wastewater Treatment Plant will happen this summer, bringing the City one step closer to meeting capacity and regulatory requirements. The user rate adjustment was approved by City Council on April 5, 2016 and will be phased in over the next two and a half years. The graphs provided here show the rate adjustment amount and timeline. The first increase will go into effect on the July utility bill.
