



New Evans Police Station Breaks Ground!

Ground was broken on the new Evans Police Station on Friday, Sept. 19. The current Evans City Council was joined by former Councilwoman/Mayor Pro Tem Laura Speer as well as City Manager Cody Sims, Police Chief Randall Darlin and members of the Evans PD and City Staff for the event. Mayor Mark Clark remarked that the new police station project has been years in the making and the City found the ideal location at 3819 Saint Vrain Street just south of the Evans Community Complex. Designed by D2C Architects with construction services provided by FCI Constructors, we are projecting an 18-month construction schedule. This new facility - funded by the Food Tax (a sales tax on food products for at-home consumption) - will provide our officers the space they need to do their jobs safely, improve recruitment and retention and help the Police Department operate more efficiently.

City Council Update - September 2025

During City Council Work Sessions in September, the Evans City Council continued their deep dive into the 2026 City budget. At the upcoming meeting on Oct. 7, the proposed operating and capital budget will be considered for an up or down vote by the Council.

Police Chief Randall Darlin presented Ordinance No. 846-25, approved unanimously by the Council, that provided authority for City to adopt state statutes related to license plate display, vehicle registration, and other similar requirements that will provide the Evans PD much needed flexibility when it comes to local enforcement and handling of routine traffic offenses.

The Councilmembers also reviewed the 30% design plans for the expansion of the Wastewater Treatment Plant. This was a routine amendment to the contract with AE2S, the firm contracted for engineering services on this project.

The Council also unanimously approved the issuance of a liquor license for the new Murphy USA fuel station at the 37th Street / Highway 85 intersection, an agreement for a mineral lease with PDC Energy, and a resolution allowing the City to dispose of the old playground equipment from Renaissance Park.

Evans City Council will consider the 2026 Operating and Capital Budget at the Oct. 7 meeting.

Mayor's Message - A letter to the Evans Community

Dear Evans Residents,

In 2020, the voters of Evans made an investment in our community by approving the 1% Street Sales Tax. Thanks to your support, we have been able to make substantial improvements to our city's streets and transportation system—projects that otherwise would have been financially impossible.

Since then, we've rebuilt and resurfaced key roadways that tens of thousands of residents and visitors use every day. Among these are:

- Construction of 23rd Avenue between 37th Street and 42nd Street
- Reconstruction of 37th Street between 35th Avenue and 47th Avenue
- Mill and overlay of 17th Avenue and 23rd Avenue between 32nd Street and 37th Street
- Reconstruction of Prairie View Drive / 42nd Street between 23rd Avenue and 35th Avenue.

These projects are not just fresh pavement—they represent safer commutes, stronger infrastructure, and a community prepared for growth.

The 1% Street Sales Tax generates about \$4 million each year. Without it, Evans would face nearly insurmountable challenges funding basic maintenance, let alone new construction. With one of the lowest municipal mill levy rates in Colorado—3.536 mills—our property tax base simply cannot cover the high costs of maintaining and rebuilding our streets.

Looking ahead, we must keep this momentum going. The City Council has placed Ballot Measure 2A on the November 2025 ballot, asking voters to extend the 1% Street Sales Tax indefinitely. The 1% Street Sales Tax is an existing tax that does not increase taxes in Evans. Instead, it strengthens our community, helps preserve property values, and takes a significant portion of the cost burden of street maintenance and rehabilitation off of the backs of Evans property owners. With a dedicated 1% street sales tax, everybody who comes to Evans to shop in our retail stores or eat at our restaurants contributes to the maintenance and rehabilitation of our street network. With this funding in place, Evans will be able to:

- Fully reconstruct 49th Street from Industrial Parkway to 65th Avenue
- Advance 37th Street Phase 4 from Arrowhead Drive to 47th Avenue
- Rebuild 35th Avenue from Prairie View Drive to 49th Street
- Improve 29th Avenue from 32nd Street to 42nd Street; and
- Continue upgrades on local streets throughout Evans.

This list is not all-inclusive, but rather a sample of projects to come. With the 1% Street Sales Tax, we will be able to reach streets throughout the entire community and continue the Evolution of Evans.

The future of our streets depends on this funding source. With your continued support, we can ensure safe, reliable, and well-maintained roads for generations to come.

Thank you for your partnership in making Evans a stronger, more connected community.

City of Evans Major Projects Update

Phase 2B of the 37th Street widening project has entered its final stages as landscaping work is being completed in early October and final paving is scheduled for the week of Oct. 20.





Work continues to progress on schedule for the 42nd Street/Prairie View Drive project. The road base has been laid down and the bottom mat of asphalt has been applied on the eastbound lanes. Work that remains includes concrete repair, the final layer of asphalt, striping, and some utility work. Following completion of the eastbound lanes, the top mat of asphalt and final striping work will be completed on the westbound lanes to finish the project.

Through FREE environmental site assessments (ESAs) and customized planning support, the Evans Property Initiative empowers commercial and industrial property owners to turn underutilized sites into thriving community assets.

Thefts From Vehicles Increasing



The **Evans Police Department** has seen a noticeable uptick in thefts from parked cars recently. In the some of the cases, the vehicles were locked, and the thieves broke into the car to remove personal items. In the majority of cases, however, the vehicles were left unlocked,

allowing the thieves to simply help themselves to whatever items of value they could find in the vehicles. The most frequent types of personal items stolen include wallets, purses, car stereos, driver's licenses, insurance and registration documents, laptop computers, cell phones, license plates and garage door opener remotes which can later be used to access the home. Not only is

the theft of personal items difficult for the victim, but many of these stolen items can be used in the commission of other, often times more serious, crimes including credit card fraud and identity theft, to name a few.

Criminal vehicle trespass, more commonly called car break-ins, usually occur in clusters within neighborhoods. Thieves will target a specific neighborhood one night and the next night or a few nights later, move on and hit other neighborhoods. The result is that cars parked anywhere throughout the City can become targets for theft.

While this type of crime is disturbing and the Evans PD is doing all they car to prevent thefts, the good news is there are a lot of easy, common sense actions residents and their visitors can take to reduce the chances of becoming a victim.

The Evans Police Department is encouraging residents to:

- Lock your car doors and seal your windows. As simple as it sounds, you would be surprised how many thefts occur from vehicles left unlocked or with the windows open overnight.
- Use all the safety features with which your vehicle is equipped.
 Make sure to activate your alarm and investigate quickly if you hear your car alarm go off while you are away from it.
- Do not leave anything of value in your car. Leaving your purse or wallet, cell phone or laptop, your golf clubs or gym bag in plain view makes it an easy target for thieves. Even a zipped-up gym bag or backpack can be tempting for a thief as they cannot be sure if the bag contains dirty exercise clothes or something far more valuable like your bankbook, membership cards, small entertainment devices or expensive tools.
- Park in a well-lit, secure area visible to others. Thieves prefer to break into vehicles parked in dark and secluded areas and avoid welllet areas as much as possible.
- Form a neighborhood watch group. Banding together with your neighbors helps provide cover for when you, or your neighbors, are away. See page 6 for more.
- Report the Crime. If you do find yourself a victim, report the crime immediately to the Evans PD.









Installing or replacing fences and expanding driveways are popular projects that do not require a building permit. However, there are guidelines to follow to keep those projects up to code:

- Fences in the rear yard setback cannot be higher than 6 feet above grade, while fences in the front yard setback cannot be higher than 4 feet from grade.
- Fences must be made of regular fencing material such as wood, vinyl, stone, or decorative iron. Barbed wire is not allowed in residential zone districts.
- We encourage anyone building a fence to call 811 for utility locate prior to any digging.
- Driveway expansions don't require a building permit but require an access permit through our Engineering Department (PW-Engineering@evanscolorado.gov).
- Driveways cannot exceed 20 feet of width where they meet the City right of way.



Outdoor Street Lighting How to report a Street Light Outage



What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example



Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.



FIRST: Select the Outages icon at the top of the page as indicated below



NEXT: Scroll to the bottom of the page and look for Outdoor lighting Outages and click on REPORT AN OUTDOOR OUTAGE as seen below



Finally: Enter your information.

- 1. Your name
- 2. Your email address: This is used to inform you when the light is repaired.
- 3. Contact phone number: This will be used to contact you should we have any questions regarding your repair request.

Pole information: ****If an outdoor lighting pole is broken, please call Xcel Energy Customer Care at 1-800-895-4999.

- 1. Select the problem with the light
- Pole number: This is where you would enter the two over two or three over three numbers on the pole.
- 3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can.
- Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

Lastly: You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button.

Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed.

***Please note: Repairs are made in 5 business days unless there is more than routine maintenance is required.
