37th Street rain alot project


Dewatering efforts deployed to keep the project on track

Northern Colorado has experienced relentless rain, tornadoes, severe thunderstorms, and the subsequent flooding from the heavy precipitation dump. The National Weather Service in Boulder reported nearly 4 inches of rain fell in the region Wednesday-Friday, with a record-setting amount of precipitation in Denver.

The historical downpour washed out plans to pour concrete at the roundabout, but proactive measures are being taken to mitigate the excess water and lost time. Crews will pump water out of the construction site, using hoses and pumps to vacuum the water and redistribute it to a safe location outside of the construction area. The crew will begin pouring once the site is dry and they receive the all-clear.

I can't find something on your website

It's been three months since the soft launch of the city's new website. In that time, we've seen success with fillable forms, email newsletters, connectivity improvement, and a tremendous upgrade on the mobile view, which is statistically the most used method by the public. Nearly 85% of our desktop views come from our own employees, while external traffic is roughly 65-35% mobile views. Meaning, the public interacts and consumes the majority of Evans's content through their phones.

With changing technology and user behavior, a website is never finished and there are always areas to improve. One area for improvement is the landing pages and their informational display. We're adding menus to the landing pages on the left-hand side, which provides the end-user with the web pages' full range of services upon arrival on the site. This cuts down on complaints and provides enhanced clarity for the end-user, which ultimately translates into a satisfied user base. Customer service is well aware of the benefits of happier, well-informed residents.

Celebrate Evans Cycling Week | June 24th-28th



Bike to Work Day and Ride with Hero highlight a week of activities designed to promote and celebrate alternative modes of transportation in Evans.

Ride with a Hero

Bike racing, food trucks, and more at the Ride with a Hero event on June 24th.

Race a firefighter, eat at a food truck, and take part in a bike obstacle course with the Evans Police Department. The event is called Ride with a Hero and will be held on June 24th from 9 am-noon at Riverside Park in Evans. It's free and open to the public. If you've ever wanted to race a firefighter, this is your moment to shine! The Evans Fire Protection District invites you to a trike racing event, where residents can put the pedal to the metal and see if they can beat our first responders to the finish line. The firefighters will also put on a fire hose shooting display, where the kids can shoot at targets with a fire hose. You might get soaked, so bring a towel!

The firefighters are just the start of a morning filled with fun. Everyone is invited to participate in a bike safety obstacle course with the Evans Police Department and play Safety Bingo for your chance to win a new bike! There will be other activities, such as face painting and a chalk walk. Attendees are encouraged to bring an appetite because several food trucks will be on hand with hot meals and ice cream! This fun-filled community event is free and open to the public.

Park the car and Bike to work on June 28th

Grab a helmet, grab a bike, and get outside for Bike to Work Day on June 28th. The City of Evans will have a bike station set up at Roasty's Coffee at 3100 11th Avenue. There are two times available, so ride through on your way to and from work. The morning shift is from 7:30-9 am and the evening shift is from 4:30-6 pm.

The day is designed to celebrate and encourage alternative modes of transportation. The first bike lane in Evans was striped in 2016, and Evans is becoming an increasingly bicycle-friendly city.
