
We're engaged!

New website forms combine with facebook and Instagram to increase community engagement.

You may not be on social media. If that's the case, congrats! But if you do choose to suffer, you know that social media can provide a barometer for public interest and engagement. For the Communications Department, it's a valuable tool for monitoring and measuring the mood and interests of the community, because the digital space offers KPI's (key performance indicators). When constructing a public outreach plan, there are no shots in the dark and there's no magic to it. Community engagement is comprised of strategic decisions based on data, target audience, demographics, algorithms, social trends, and the availability of physical and digital media assets. It's engineered like a well-constructed infrastructure project.

How's the City of Evans doing? We're always researching improved methods of outreach, but the City of Evans's Facebook has seen a 592% increase in overall engagement over the last 5 months, compared to the same time period in 2022. In the month of April alone, the city saw an 88.3% increase over the month of March, despite having 27% less posts. The Evans PD's facebook has seen a 145% increase over the same period. Contractors were rolling through the first month of work on the 37th Street roundabout, but you know the timeless, classic trope: *April showers bring construction projects to a grinding halt*. Ok, maybe that's not a saying, but it's true. A heavy dose of rain washed out two days of work, but contractors are planning to work on Saturday to reset the schedule. Despite the minor setback, there has been palpable progress. Fiber lines are installed and significant headway was made on soft spot repair, which is a necessary precursor to paving, and last we checked, paving's a pretty big deal on a road project.

Evans Police raise nearly \$3K for Special Olympics

On Saturday, April 15th, a group of very generous, mostly crazy Evans employees and Council Member Fred Neal, voluntarily ran headfirst into Windsor Lake. The good news is that they were joined by a few thousand other very generous, mostly crazy northern Coloradoans in raising money for the Colorado Special Olympics. The bad news is that a relentless north wind assaulted them as they emerged from the icy, whitecapped seas of Windsor Lake. Altogether, the event raised nearly \$100,000 for Colorado Special Olympics, making the voluntary ice bath worthy of the plunge. If jumping into a freezing lake wasn't enough, some of the team voluntarily ran 3 miles before the plunge. Evans's own Heather Utrata took second place overall in the 5k marathon. Congrats, Heather!

Celebrate Evans Cycling Week | June 24th-28th



Bike to Work Day and Ride with Hero highlight a week of activities designed to promote and celebrate alternative modes of transportation in Evans.

Ride with a Hero

Bike racing, food trucks, and more at the Ride with a Hero event on June 24th.

Race a firefighter, eat at a food truck, and take part in a bike obstacle course with the Evans Police Department. The event is called Ride with a Hero and will be held on June 24th from 9 am-noon at Riverside Park in Evans. It's free and open to the public. If you've ever wanted to race a firefighter, this is your moment to shine! The Evans Fire Protection District invites you to a trike racing event, where residents can put the pedal to the metal and see if they can beat our first responders to the finish line. The firefighters will also put on a fire hose shooting display, where the kids can shoot at targets with a fire hose. You might get soaked, so bring a towel!

The firefighters are just the start of a morning filled with fun. Everyone is invited to participate in a bike safety obstacle course with the Evans Police Department and play Safety Bingo for your chance to win a new bike! There will be other activities, such as face painting and a chalk walk. Attendees are encouraged to bring an appetite because several food trucks will be on hand with hot meals and ice cream! This fun-filled community event is free and open to the public.

Park the car and Bike to work on June 28th

Grab a helmet, grab a bike, and get outside for Bike to Work Day on June 28th. The City of Evans will have a bike station set up at Roasty's Coffee at 3100 11th Avenue. There are two times available, so ride through on your way to and from work. The morning shift is from 7:30-9 am and the evening shift is from 4:30-6 pm.

The day is designed to celebrate and encourage alternative modes of transportation. The first bike lane in Evans was striped in 2016, and Evans is becoming an increasingly bicycle-friendly city. Emergency Planning

Risk Management staff attended the Weld County Local Emergency Planning Committee Meeting (LEPC) on Thursday, April 27th. The City works to prepare for emergencies before they occur so that we properly anticipate and respond to critical situations.

Weld County LEPC continues to work with local government, fire districts, and industry partners to:

- Identify risks and hazards to our community
- · Plan for the identified risks
- Identify response capabilities and gaps in response
- Work with industry to identify how they can reduce risk at their facilities based on best practices and coordination with first responder agencies



The Risk Management staff also held First Aid/CPR/AED Training on April 19th.
