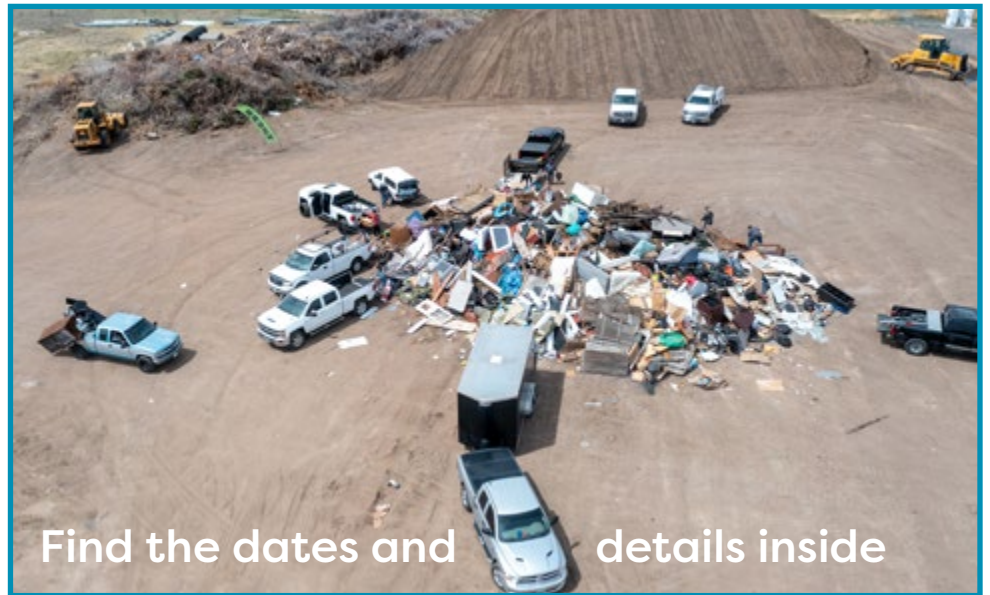

Spend a few minutes of your Saturday creating a safer community to live in.

The Evans Police Department, along with the Evans Fire Protection District, are hosting Drug Take-Back Day. The bi-annual event is held in the spring and fall gives individuals in the community a safe place to dispose of their unused or expired prescription drugs.



WHAT: Drug Take Back Day

WHERE: 3247 23rd Ave, Evans, CO 80620

WHEN: Saturday, April 22nd, 2023 | 10am-2pm

COST: FREE

It's an easy and rewarding experience.

Simply place your disposable prescription drugs in a clear plastic bag, drive to event and hand your items to the First Responders working the event. You don't need to leave your car, unless you just want to hang out.



The drug overdose epidemic in the United States is a clear and present public health, public safety, and national security threat. DEA's National Prescription Drug Take Back Day reflects DEA's commitment to Americans' safety and health, encouraging the public to remove unneeded medications from their homes as a measure of preventing medication misuse and opioid addiction from ever starting.

Soil breaks on new roundabout in Evans

Cost savings, strategic planning involved in initial stages of construction

History was made on Wednesday, March 22nd, when the City of Evans broke ground on its first-ever arterial roundabout at the intersection of 37th Street and 47th Avenue. The project is technically referred to as the **Phase I - 37th Street Widening** project and is part of a larger street infrastructure initiative that will eventually see 37th Street widened from 35th Avenue to 65th Avenue.

"This is really going to be a great thing to increase safety and the flow of traffic in west Evans," Evans Mayor Mark Clark said. "This shows our commitment to improving the streets in Evans for our residents. It will go a long way towards improving the appearance of our city and will alleviate a lot of heavy traffic as the population continues to grow."

Strategic planning saves taxpayer money and time.

Crews began project by creating a metal casing to surround a plastic waterline. By doing this, the City will not need to dig up the roundabout to fix the waterline if future maintenance has to be done. The city will be able to conduct waterline maintenance and repairs outside of the roundabout by sliding the plastic piping to an opening outside of the intersection. This will reduce maintenance time and decrease the costs of the repair.



The Road Ahead 1% Sales Tax Project:

When the residents of Evans voted to increase the city's annual street budget through *The Road Ahead 1% sales tax for street maintenance and repair*, the city made a commitment to enhance the safety and quality of its streets. On Wednesday, March 22nd, 2023, that commitment continues when the 37th Street roundabout breaks ground at the intersection of 47th Avenue and 37th Street. Officially titled **Phase I - 37th Street Widening**, this project will feature a hard closure that will be in place to increase the safety of the workers and decrease the time needed to complete the project. Detours are available, indicated in yellow on the map, on 65th Avenue, US-34, 35th Avenue, and 49th Street.



Since The Road Ahead 1% sales tax for street maintenance and repair was passed in 2019, progress on the streets is palpable. The City of Evans has completed, broke ground on, or designed more than 40 infrastructure projects. Noticeable road improvements can be seen on 23rd Avenue, 37th Street, 47th Avenue, 35th Avenue, Idaho Street, and 31st Street. Additionally, the City has placed an emphasis on concrete replacement, storm sewer enhancement, and replacing the aging, underground utilities when it is required. Our alleyway improvement program has also served as an aesthetic and functional improvement to the roads.

According to several safety studies, roundabouts reduce traffic accidents and increase traffic flow. According to the IIHS:



GET THE FACTS

- Studies of intersections in the United States converted from traffic signals or stop signs to roundabouts have found reductions in injury crashes of 72-80 percent and reductions in all crashes of 35-47 percent (Retting et al., 2001; Eisenman et al., 2004; Rodegerdts et al., 2007).
- A study of 19 higher-speed rural intersections (speed limits of 40 mph or higher) that originally had stop signs on the minor approaches and were converted to roundabouts found a 62 percent reduction in all crashes and an 85 percent reduction in injury crashes (Isebrands & Hallmark, 2012).
- Studies of intersections in Europe and Australia that were converted to roundabouts have reported 25-87 percent reductions in injury crashes and 36-61 percent reductions in all crashes (Rodegerdts et al., 2010).
- Based on the results of a 2004 study (Eisenman et al., 2004), it's estimated that the conversion of 10 percent of the signalized intersections in the United States to roundabouts would have prevented approximately 51,000 crashes in 2018, including 231 fatal crashes and about 34,000 crashes involving injuries.
- A study of three intersections in Kansas, Maryland and Nevada where roundabouts replaced stop signs found that vehicle delays were reduced 13-23 percent and the proportion of vehicles that stopped was reduced 14-37 percent (Retting et al., 2002).
- A study of three locations in New Hampshire, New York and Washington state where roundabouts replaced traffic signals or stop signs found an 89 percent average reduction in vehicle delays and a 56 percent average reduction in vehicle stops (Retting et al., 2006).
- A study of 11 intersections in Kansas found a 65 percent average reduction in delays and a 52 percent average reduction in vehicle stops after roundabouts were installed (Russell et al., 2004).
- An Institute study of two-lane roundabout conversions at two intersections near Bellingham, Washington, found substantial declines in vehicle delays on the minor roads (33 percent and 90 percent) and the proportion of vehicles waiting in queues (35 percent and 43 percent) (Hu et al., 2014). Overall intersections delays increased (12 percent and 22 percent), due to slightly longer delays on the major approaches as vehicles slowed to enter the roundabouts.

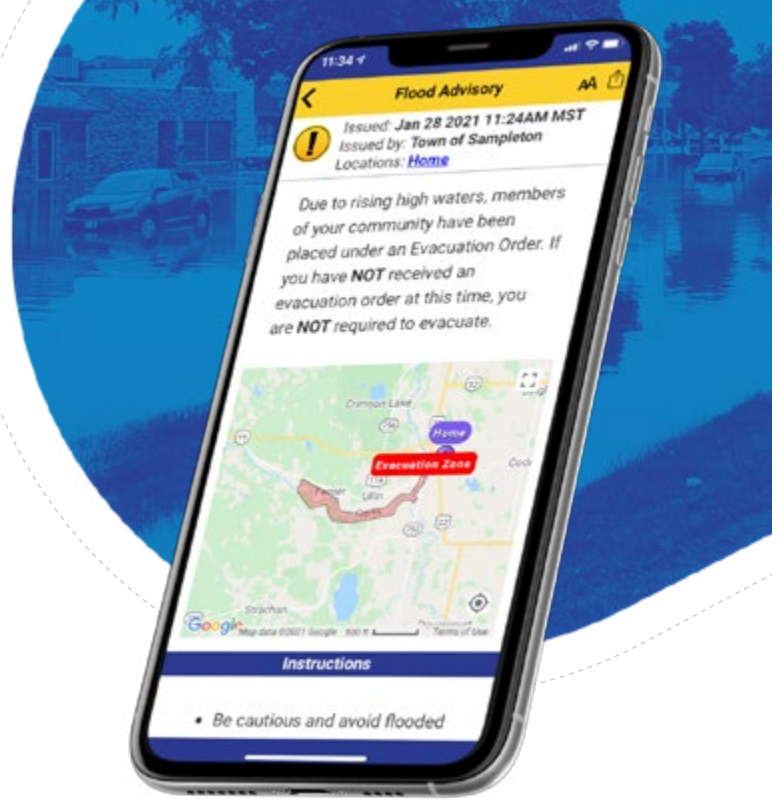

Who can participate?

All residents of Evans are welcome to participate in the **City Cleanup Event** with proof of residency such as a driver's license or water bill verifying their home address.

How much does it cost?

One pickup load or small trailer of trash or yard debris currently costs \$10. Larger loads will require additional fees as calculated by staff. Tires start at \$3 each and have variable pricing based on the size, and type of tire. Evans utility customers will receive one free voucher per event by mail.

What is it?

City cleanup events occur twice per year in the spring and fall to assist Evans residents in disposing of large or bulky trash and debris. The purpose of the event is to supplement weekly trash service with an opportunity to dispose of tree limbs, yard debris, unwanted furniture, and other regular household waste.

What is NOT accepted?

Household hazardous waste, electronics, fluids, and other toxic or hazardous waste is not accepted at the event. Many of these items may be recycled throughout the year at various locations. Please see the attached Evans Area Recycling Guide for resources to recycle items not accepted at the event.

Boats, vehicles, recreational vehicles, hot tubs, and other oversized items will not be accepted. Please contact a salvage yard or waste hauler for more information on disposing of these items.

The answer? *The City of Evans Neighborhood Party Trailer!*

What is it?

The **Neighborhood Party Trailer** was made possible by a generous donation from Sam's Club, and contains all of the essentials to host a block party, neighborhood watch meeting, or similar community event. The organizer simply reserves the trailer, invites the guests, and makes arrangements for food and drinks. The Neighborhood Party Trailer is a great tool to build community, strengthen neighborhoods, and to get outside and enjoy our beautiful City!

How does it work?

Organizers looking to host an event need only check the dates that the trailer is available for reservation and apply to reserve the trailer. Staff will review the application as quickly as possible and contact the applicant to confirm the reservation, or to gather additional information and work out the details. On the day of the reservation, City staff will deliver and secure the trailer, and contact the organizer with a code to unlock the trailer. The organizer may then unlock and use the contents of the trailer, and when finished, replace clean items to their designated locations, and lock the doors. Staff will return during working hours to retrieve the trailer.

Who can reserve it?

Any resident of Evans, 18 or older, is eligible to reserve the trailer. The applicant must demonstrate in the application that the event is a community event such as a block party or neighborhood watch meeting, and not a private event such as a birthday or graduation party.

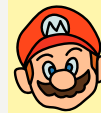

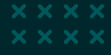
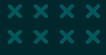
