



## City reinstates permitting for garage sales

The Evans City Council recently reimplemented the City's garage sale permit requirement by adopting Ordinance No. 861-26. While the permit requirement is new to many residents, it is actually a return to a policy that was in place from 1975 until 2008.



The free permit is not intended to generate revenue but to provide a simple tracking system that allows the City to enforce existing regulations fairly and consistently.

The regulations have not changed from those established under the original 1975 ordinance. Garage sales remain limited to no more than two consecutive days, with no more than two garage sales per calendar year conducted by the same person at the same property. The permit provides a straightforward way for the City to track these limits, ensuring all residents are held to the same standards. It also helps prevent permanent or recurring garage sales that function as ongoing retail businesses, as well as the resale of merchandise purchased to be resold, which has long been prohibited.

Garage sale permits are provided at no cost and are available for download on the City's website. Completed applications may be submitted to the City Clerk's Office by email or in person. Residents are encouraged to apply at least three business days before their sale to allow sufficient time for processing and should display the approved permit during the event. The process is designed to be simple, convenient, and accessible while helping the City administer the ordinance consistently and equitably. Residents with questions, comments, or concerns regarding the policy are encouraged to contact their City Council representative directly.

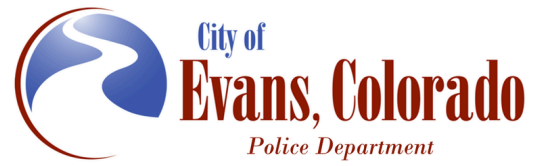


## Evans Police Chief to present information on speed cameras at July 7 Council Work Session

# A Message from Chief Randy Darlin



If you've lived in Evans for very long, you've probably heard someone say, "People drive way too fast down this road."

The truth is, I've heard it too.

Whether it's in our neighborhoods, near our schools, around our parks, or on some of our busiest streets, speeding is one of the concerns residents bring to me most often. It's also something our officers see every day. While most people drive responsibly, it only takes a few drivers making poor decisions to create a serious risk for everyone else.

The good news is that most drivers want to do the right thing. Sometimes all it takes is a reminder to slow down before someone gets hurt.

That's why we've been looking at every tool available to improve roadway safety, including Colorado's Automated Vehicle Identification System, or AVIS.

I also want to be upfront about where we are in the process.

Earlier this year, the City Council approved a contract that allows the Police Department to move forward with implementing an AVIS program. That decision has already been made. What hasn't been finalized is how the program will be implemented here in Evans. That's where we are today.

Before any cameras are installed or activated, I'll be presenting the traffic safety data, speed studies, crash history, and other information we've used to identify potential enforcement corridors under Colorado law. I'll also explain why those locations are being considered, how the technology works, and how we're proposing to use one fixed camera location and one mobile enforcement trailer to support our overall traffic safety efforts.

My goal isn't simply to present information. It's to make sure our community understands what we're doing, why we're doing it, and how these decisions are being made.

I also know the data doesn't tell the whole story.

The people who drive on these streets every day often notice things that don't show up in a traffic study. Maybe there's a stretch of road where you've watched drivers speed for years. Maybe there's a crosswalk that makes you nervous when your children use it. Maybe you've had a close call pulling out of your neighborhood because traffic is moving too fast.



Or maybe you simply have questions about how this technology works or how it will be used. I want to hear those things.

The work session itself is designed to provide information to City Council, so there won't be public comment during that portion of the meeting. However, the regular City Council meeting immediately follows, and every resident has the opportunity to speak during public comment for up to three minutes on any topic, including this one.

And if speaking at the podium isn't your thing, that's okay. I'll be there after the meeting, and I'd be happy to visit with you one-on-one. Sometimes those conversations are the most valuable because they give us the chance to listen, answer questions, and better understand each other's perspectives.

Whether you support this program, have concerns about it, or are still making up your mind, I hope you'll come. My commitment is to be open about the process, answer your questions honestly, and listen to what you have to say.

This work session is just the beginning of our community education effort. In the weeks ahead, we'll continue sharing information about how the program works, how enforcement corridors are selected, the safeguards required by Colorado law, and what residents can expect before the system becomes operational. My goal is for everyone to have the information they need to understand the program before it goes into service.

At the end of the day, this really isn't about cameras. It's about slowing traffic down before someone gets hurt. It's about making it safer for a parent to walk with their child to school, for someone to ride a bike through their neighborhood, or for a family to make it home safely after a long day.

If we can reduce speeding, prevent crashes, and make our roads safer for everyone, then we've accomplished exactly what we set out to do.

If you have the time, I'd appreciate you coming. Listen to the presentation, think about the information, and let me know what you think. Whether that's during public comment or in a conversation after the meeting, I'd genuinely like to hear your perspective.

## Evans Business Spotlight – La Chapina Restaurant and Panaderia Quetzal



Did you know that a slice of Guatemalan culture exists right here in Evans?

Evans is home to the family-owned and operated businesses of Panaderia Quetzal and La Chapina Family Restaurant. Both businesses are owned by the same family, which includes parents Armando Chanchavac and Ana Pastor, and their grown children, Evelin Chanchavac-Pastor, Felix Chanchavac-Pastor and Daysie Chanchavac-Pastor.

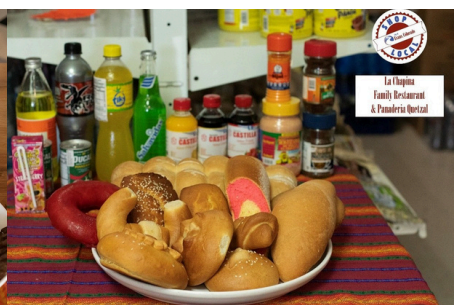
In 2017, the family opened Panaderia Quetzal, which started as a small bakery, making traditional Guatemalan breads and sweets such as Pan Francés, pirujo, pan galleta and more. They soon expanded the store to carry Guatemalan and Central American spices, foods, snacks, drinks and more. Today, you can find a wide variety of products including homemade frozen treats, hard-to-find foods and ingredients, and unique beverages. The family also began cooking meals in the small shop, and their reputation quickly grew along the front range. The two tables inside the store were often occupied, as visitors came to get a taste of Guatemala.

In December 2025, the family expanded their business and opened a full-service restaurant, La Chapina, just two doors down from Panaderia Quetzal. The inside of La Chapina is spacious, colorful and welcoming, and the menu offers many traditional as well as unique plates from Guatemala.

When asked about the recipes used in the restaurant, Armando states that the recipes are from him and his wife’s families, as well as family recipes introduced by other employees. Some of their menu items (pictured) include tamales, caldo de gallina asado, pupusas, and their signature plate, platillo la Chapina.

Evelin Chanchavac-Pastor would like the public to know that visitors are welcome. “We want people to know that they can come and try and experience Guatemalan culture and cuisine.” She hopes that their restaurant and bakery can be a welcoming place and a place to try new foods and drinks.

# Summer Lawn Watering Tips

Please note, sprinkler cycle and soak can help increase efficiency and reduce runoff. Run 2-3 cycles 45-60 minutes apart with the total run time for the day equal the duration recommended in the table above.

\*Please note that these are recommended run times for our region, if your lawn is suffering at these recommended run times please adjust time and cycles accordingly. Alternatively, if you water less than this and your lawn is healthy, do not water more than needed.

## The City of Evans has Outdoor Watering Policies effective between April 15 and October 15.

Outdoor watering is allowed on scheduled days except between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

- Single-family homes with even-numbered addresses shall only use outdoor irrigation on Sunday, Tuesday, and Thursday of each week.
- Single-family homes with odd-numbered addresses shall only use outdoor irrigation on Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday of each week.
- All other properties including commercial, multi-family residences, apartments, government, and nonprofit organizations shall only use outdoor irrigation on Sunday, Tuesday and Friday of each week.

## RECYCLING IS REAL



### Bottle = Shirt

The plastic water bottles you recycle can be made into thread for fabric used to make clothing, backpacks, sneakers and more.



### Paper = Paperboard

The clean paper you recycle is pulped and made into paperboard packaging for cereal, crackers and other household goods.



### Jug = Carpet

The thick multi-gallon plastic water jugs you recycle can be made into carpet for homes and businesses.



### Can = Can

The aluminum beverage cans you recycle today will be back on the shelf as a new can in about 60 days.



# RECYCLE RIGHT

Only place the following in your recycle cart

- Clean cardboard
- Paper
- Metal cans
- Glass bottles and jars
- Plastic containers shaped like bottles, jars, jugs and tubs.



Do **NOT** put any of these items in your recycle cart

- Food or liquids
- Plastic bags
- Batteries, electronics
- Clothing or carpet
- Paper towels, cups, napkins or plates
- Concrete or wood
- Styrofoam, scrap metal
- Yard waste

## How to report a Street Light Outage



### What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example



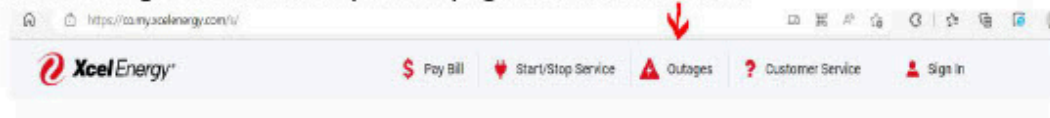
Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.

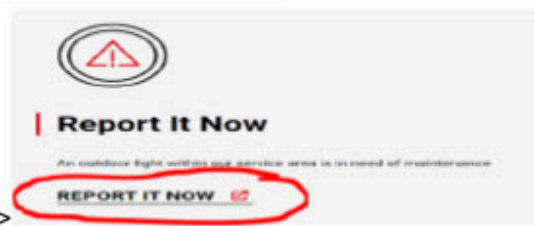

**FIRST:** Select the Outages icon at the top of the page as indicated below



**NEXT:** Scroll to the bottom of the page and look for **Outdoor lighting Outages** and click on **REPORT AN OUTDOOR OUTAGE** as seen below



Next: Click on **Report it now** →

**Finally:** Enter your information.

1. Your name
2. Your email address: This is used to inform you when the light is repaired.
3. Contact phone number: This will be used to contact you should we have any questions regarding your repair request.

**Pole information:** \*\*\*\*If an outdoor lighting pole is broken, please call Xcel Energy Customer Care at 1-800-895-4999.

1. Select the problem with the light
2. Pole number: This is where you would enter the two over two or three over three numbers on the pole.
3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can.
4. Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

**Lastly:** You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button.

Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed.
