



City Declares Drought Emergency, outdoor watering restrictions in effect through Oct. 15.

The Evans City Council unanimously approved a drought emergency declaration and an emergency ordinance to expand outdoor watering restrictions for the 2026 irrigation season.

Effective immediately, outdoor watering is prohibited between 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., an expansion from the previous noon to 5:00 p.m. restriction. These measures are in place to reduce water loss due to evaporation and ensure responsible use of the community's water resources during dry conditions.

City seeking applicants for Evans Water & Sewer Board.

The City of Evans is now accepting applications for vacancies on the Water & Sewer Board, a vital volunteer advisory board that helps guide decisions impacting our community's water system, infrastructure, and long-term sustainability. Visit the city website for more info. The five-member board, appointed by City Council, meets on the third Thursday of each month at 3:30 p.m. See city website for more details.

The seasonal outdoor watering policies remain in effect April 15 through October 15, with watering allowed only on designated days outside restricted hours:

- Even-numbered addresses: Sunday, Tuesday, Thursday
- Odd-numbered addresses: Monday, Wednesday, Saturday
- Multi-family residences/apartments, commercial properties: Sunday, Tuesday, Friday

Watering during the heat of the day significantly reduces efficiency, as much of the water is lost to evaporation before it can benefit lawns and landscaping.



New monthly survey allows Evans residents to help shape the city

The Evans Community Pulse Survey is a quick, anonymous monthly survey that allows residents to share feedback on city services, projects, and community priorities. Responses help City leadership improve services and guide future planning. The survey takes less than two minutes to complete and is released on the third Tuesday of each month through the city website and social media channels.

Council Approves Master Services Agreement for Speed Cameras

The Evans City Council approved a master services agreement with Sensys Gatso for the implementation and operation of Automated Vehicle Identification System (AVIS), also known as speed cameras, for traffic safety enforcement around the city. The 5-year agreement will see the city operate one fixed enforcement unit and one mobile enforcement unit. In the coming months, required signage and public awareness efforts will be undertaken by the Evans PD to promote transparency and conform with state laws related to AVIS systems. Evans Chief of Police Randall Darlin explained to the council that deploying AVIS technology in similar municipalities has resulted in increased traffic safety as well as net-positive impacts on the budget.

At the April 7 meeting, the city council approved an ordinance to adopt state-mandated landscaping requirements. Also on April 7, the Evans Redevelopment Agency unanimously approved a Master Option Agreement with Arbor Capital Partners for the development of just under nine acres at the Evans Junction property at the southwest corner of 31st Street and Highway 85. Arbor Capital will be prospecting and developing new commercial opportunities at the location. The agreement requires Arbor Capital to submit construction drawings and secure a tenant lease for at least one of the five properties on the site within 24 months. The lots will be purchased separately for a total price of \$3.512 million. At the April 21 meeting, in addition to declaring the drought emergency and approving an emergency ordinance to expand daytime watering restrictions from 12pm to 5pm daily to 10am to 6pm daily, conforming with industry best practices to prevent evaporation in the daytime heat, the council also voted to allow the disposal and sale of city assets, including some unused vehicles and the old playground equipment from Renaissance Park.

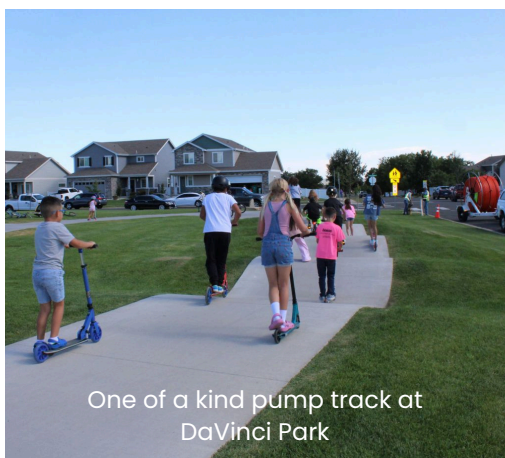

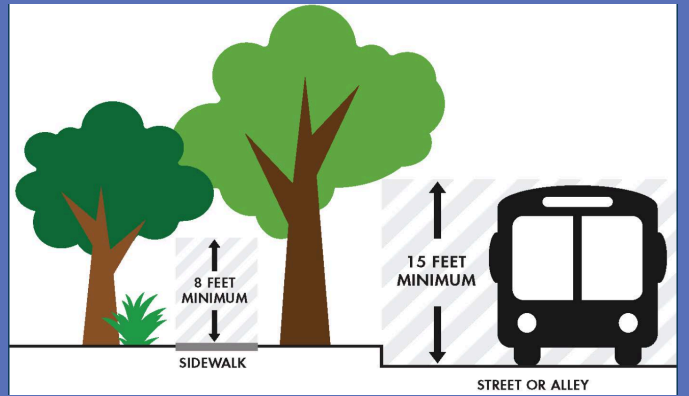

Code enforcement officers investigate code violations on private property related to:

- Inoperable Vehicles
- Trash, Junk, and Outside Storage
- Tall and Noxious Weeds
- Hazardous Trees
- Brush
- Dirt Piles and Debris
- Snow on Sidewalks
- Maintenance of Fences
- Graffiti Removal



Evans residents ages 18 and older can reserve the Neighborhood Party Trailer for community-focused events like block parties or neighborhood watch meetings. Applicants can check available dates and submit a reservation form online. City staff will review requests, coordinate delivery and pickup, and provide access instructions on the day of the event. Reservations are limited to twice per household or property each calendar year, unless tied to a citywide public event.

Please note, sprinkler cycle and soak can help increase efficiency and reduce runoff. Run 2-3 cycles 45-60 minutes apart with the total run time for the day equal the duration recommended in the table above.

*Please note that these are recommended run times for our region, if your lawn is suffering at these recommended run times please adjust time and cycles accordingly. Alternatively, if you water less than this and your lawn is healthy, do not water more than needed.

The City of Evans has Outdoor Watering Policies effective between April 15 and October 15.

Outdoor watering is allowed on scheduled days except between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

- Single-family homes with even-numbered addresses shall only use outdoor irrigation on Sunday, Tuesday, and Thursday of each week.
- Single-family homes with odd-numbered addresses shall only use outdoor irrigation on Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday of each week.
- All other properties including commercial, multi-family residences, apartments, government, and nonprofit organizations shall only use outdoor irrigation on Sunday, Tuesday and Friday of each week.

RECYCLING IS REAL



Bottle = Shirt

The plastic water bottles you recycle can be made into thread for fabric used to make clothing, backpacks, sneakers and more.



Paper = Paperboard

The clean paper you recycle is pulped and made into paperboard packaging for cereal, crackers and other household goods.



Jug = Carpet

The thick multi-gallon plastic water jugs you recycle can be made into carpet for homes and businesses.



Can = Can

The aluminum beverage cans you recycle today will be back on the shelf as a new can in about 60 days.



RECYCLE RIGHT

Only place the following in your recycle cart

- Clean cardboard
- Paper
- Metal cans
- Glass bottles and jars
- Plastic containers shaped like bottles, jars, jugs and tubs.



Do **NOT** put any of these items in your recycle cart

- Food or liquids
- Plastic bags
- Batteries, electronics
- Clothing or carpet
- Paper towels, cups, napkins or plates
- Concrete or wood
- Styrofoam, scrap metal
- Yard waste

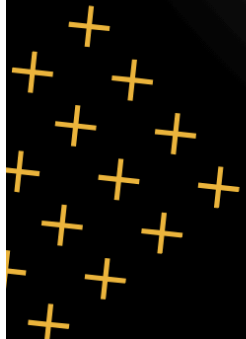

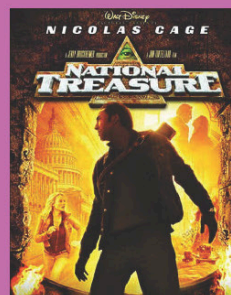

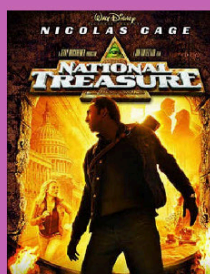

How to report a Street Light Outage



What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example



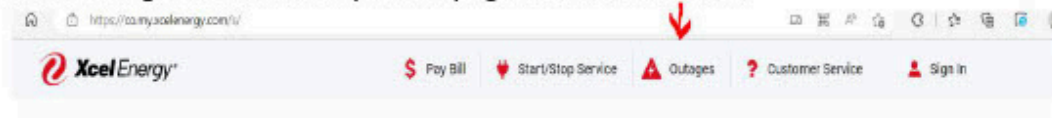
Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.

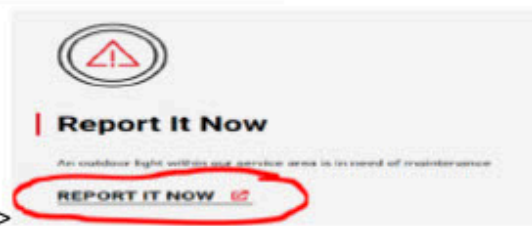

FIRST: Select the Outages icon at the top of the page as indicated below



NEXT: Scroll to the bottom of the page and look for **Outdoor lighting Outages** and click on **REPORT AN OUTDOOR OUTAGE** as seen below



Next: Click on **Report it now** →

Finally: Enter your information.

1. Your name
2. Your email address: This is used to inform you when the light is repaired.
3. Contact phone number: This will be used to contact you should we have any questions regarding your repair request.

Pole information: ****If an outdoor lighting pole is broken, please call Xcel Energy Customer Care at 1-800-895-4999.

1. Select the problem with the light
2. Pole number: This is where you would enter the two over two or three over three numbers on the pole.
3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can.
4. Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

Lastly: You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button.

Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed.

***Please note: Repairs are made in 5 business days unless there is more than routine maintenance is required.
