City Council Update – April 2025

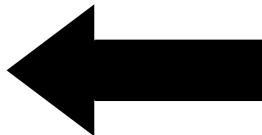
At the two regular business meetings in the month of April, the Evans City Council approved two liquor licenses – one for on-site consumption at Frida Grill and one for retail sales at the new Murphy USA fueling station on 35th Ave. The Councilmembers also voted to approve a site improvements agreement for a Dollar General at the northwest corner of 35th Ave. and 35th St. Mayor Mark Clark also affixed his signature to two official City proclamations commemorating Days of Remembrance and Arbor Day.

Evans Junction commercial development project nearing completion!

The Evans Junction commercial site, located on the southwest corner of 31st St. and Highway 85, will be completed this month. Work to install infrastructure and prepare the four lots has progressed smoothly. The first tenant at the site – a McDonald's which will be located at the northwestern corner of the site – will break ground as soon as work is finished. An aggressive construction schedule will see the quick service food chain open its doors later this year.



After additional discussion and deliberation, the Evans City Council decided that vouchers for the 2025 Spring Cleanup Event will cost \$15 apiece. Each voucher is good for one standard sized pickup load of debris (roughly two cubic yards) with larger and additional loads costing \$15 each. Evans trash customers, with proof of residency, can purchase vouchers at the Evans Community Complex Customer Service windows during normal business hours or at the gate on the day of the event. Another retail establishment will be coming to Evans soon as site improvements agreement for a Dollar General was approved in April.

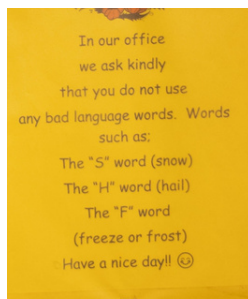

Business Spotlight - Happy Life Gardens

When you drive on 37th Ave in Evans in the spring and summer months, you can't help but notice Happy Life Gardens. The plants and flowers on display in front of the store are just a preview of what else garden lovers will find inside.

Since March of 2013, Eddie and Melissa Maxwell have owned and operated Happy Life Gardens. A locally-owned nursery, garden center, greenhouse and landscape yard, Happy Life Gardens has whatever you need for your patio, yard or outdoor living space this season.

When you walk through the front door, you enter the garden shop, which has pots, watering cans, indoor plants, a large variety of seeds, as well as fun decorations such as garden gnomes, humorous signs and more. When you walk out the back door of the shop, you walk into a greenhouse that is an explosion of beautiful colors, floral aromas and vibrant displays.



Take your time and walk through row after row of the plants, annuals, perennials and more on display. At peak season, there are 20 employees there to answer questions, provide advice and make suggestions. The depth of knowledge of the employees is evident in the way they interact with customers and talk about the plants and flowers surrounding them.

Outside the greenhouse, there is a huge variety of plants and flowers in their outdoor shop. On the east side of the property, there is a large lot with landscaping materials such as mulch, fill dirt, river rock, wall rock, boulders and more.

When asked why Maxwell started this business with his wife Melissa, he said: "We felt that God was calling us to work as a family toward a common goal and we wanted to be able to experience the triumphs and trials of life side-by-side in a way that a corporate setting would not allow."

Eddie and Melissa's two sons have grown up in the business, and Maxwell is proud of the young men they have become.

Happy Life Gardens is an important business citizen of the Evans community, but the feeling is mutual when it comes to the relationship Eddie and Melissa have built with their customers: "It has also been very rewarding to interact and become friends with so many members of the community. We enjoy being able to help people become more knowledgeable about gardening and landscaping."

Happy Life has also been host to various animals over the years, including chickens, ducks, pygmy goats, baby doll sheep, rabbits and more. Maxwell enjoys watching the customers interact with the animals: "It is fun to see a person's demeanor change as soon as they see a baby animal." If you visit, you will likely also see Piper, the official mascot of Happy Life.

The City of Evans is thrilled to launch the Evans Property Initiative, an exciting effort to revitalize the U.S. Highway 85 Corridor through environmental assessment, planning support, and economic development. Thanks to a \$500,000 Community-wide Assessment Grant from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), this initiative provides commercial and industrial property owners with the resources they need to unlock new opportunities for growth and investment.

At the heart of the program is the revitalization of brownfields—properties where real or perceived environmental challenges are hindering redevelopment. Through FREE environmental site assessments (ESAs) and customized planning support, the Evans Property Initiative empowers commercial and industrial property owners to turn underutilized sites into thriving community assets.

The initiative is designed to:

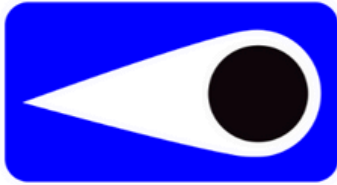
- Create a Property Inventory – Mapping sites along Highway 85 to identify redevelopment opportunities.

How to report a Street Light Outage



What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example



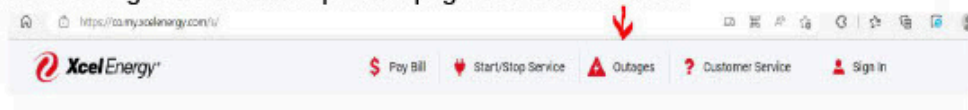
Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.

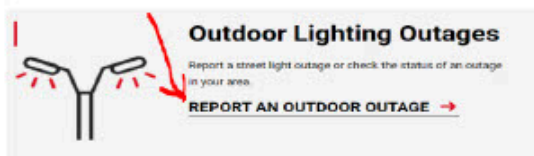
Where to report a Street light Outage?

FIRST: Select the Outages icon at the top of the page as indicated below



NEXT: Scroll to the bottom of the page and look for **Outdoor lighting Outages** and click on **REPORT AN OUTDOOR OUTAGE** as seen below



Next: Click on **Report it now** →

Finally: Enter your information.

1. Your name
2. Your email address: This is used to inform you when the light is repaired.
3. Contact phone number: This will be used to contact you should we have any questions regarding your repair request.

Pole information: ****If an outdoor lighting pole is broken, please call Xcel Energy Customer Care at 1-800-895-4999.

1. Select the problem with the light
2. Pole number: This is where you would enter the two over two or three over three numbers on the pole.
3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can.
4. Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

Lastly: You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button.

Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed.

*****Please note:** Repairs are made in 5 business days unless there is more than routine maintenance is required.
