City Council Update





Evans Mayor Mark Clark, right, was joined by Tiffany Ochoa and Bobby Torres from Arc of Weld County as the City Proclaimed March to be Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month in the City.



The subject that drew that most attention in the month of March pertained to the RV, boat and trailer storage regulations that went into effect at the turn of the year. After listening to the sizable volume of resident feedback and consulting with City Staff, the Councilmembers determined that the goals the measure was intended to help achieve can be attained with current code already in effect and voted unanimously to repeal the subsection of the Land Development Code (18.02.040.N) in question.

The Council, on March 19, voted unanimously on first reading to enter into a non-exclusive contract with Allo Communications, LLC for the latter to install their fiberoptic internet infrastructure in the City. This decision will increase the competition for high-speed internet and digital television service, providing Evans residents with an expanded list of options for this increasingly important and highly sought after service. The Councilmembers questioned and got assurances from Allo representatives that the company will work diligently to inform residents when work is being done in their neighborhoods and vowed to quickly repair any accidental damage to private property that results from installation of the network infrastructure.

Looking ahead... The month of April is shaping up to be another busy one for the City Council, with regular meetings scheduled for April 2nd and 16th and a special budget work session for April 30. At the April 2nd meeting, Council will get updates on economic development and rules for the cemetery as well as consider adopting an updated engineering fee schedule, examine a potential design contract for the property on the southwest corner of 31st Street and Highway 85 and consider a site improvement agreement for a Murphy's gas station on 37th Street and 35th Avenue. On April 16, it is tentatively scheduled for the Council to receive updates from the Evans Fire District, Vero Broadband and Baessler Homes (Liberty Draw) as well as consider options for the Council's Discretional Funds Grant program.

GOVERNMENT 101 - Community Beautification

The Evans City Council has as its primary goal the expansion and diversification of the local economy. One of the guiding pillars in achieving that goal is enhancing the aesthetics of the City – what has come to be called community beautification.

In order to improve the look of our community, all residents, businesses, and, yes, the City itself, are responsible for putting forth their best efforts to achieve the desired ends. In 2023, the City made a concerted effort to clean up our own buildings and spaces, adding new landscaping in multiple areas, either scrapping or selling off a large number of unused and decrepit vehicles and tools from the City's parks maintenance and operations divisions and completing a sizable amount of clean up and repair work on City buildings and property.



The City of Evans is investing in upgrades to landscaping all across the City, particularly along our major thoroughfares. To do this in a budget-conscious manner, a lot of new landscaping is comprised of decorative stone with water-wise foliage included to accent and complement the harder materials; the City's non-potable water system is used for irrigation where possible in landscaping the does require watering. The City is also investing heavily in sprucing up our public parks; refurbishment has been done just since the turn of the year to the Freedom Dog Park, work has begun on significant upgrades at DaVinci Park (see page 18), and a request for proposals for design upgrades for a park in the Hunter's Reserve neighborhood has been posted and will close on April 4.

In addition to landscaping projects – which will continue with new road work as well as along the U.S. Highway 85 corridor on the east side of town - the City was grateful to partner with local artists and design studios to add vinyl wraps to the seven new traffic control cabinets that were installed last winter as well as for the filter station at Driftwood Park. These wraps not only create head-turning displays of public art, but they also aid in deterring graffiti on public property. Plans for adding wraps to other such infrastructure around the City are in the works.

Another way the City is working to improve and enhance the overall look of Evans is through the code enforcement process. It is the responsibility of the property owner to assure their home and yard are in compliance with the City code. There are requirements regarding tree trimming, control of weeds and brush, trash, junk and outdoor storage, inoperable/unlicensed vehicles, and vehicle parking. Homeowners in violation of any of these ordinances will receive a courtesy notice from the City informing them of the violation and requesting it be rectified in a specific time frame. Violations of City codes, if left unfixed with in the defined time frame, can result in fines being levied on the property owner. Many of the ordinances are in place have a dual benefit of increasing public safety and improving the City's image.

With the arrival of spring comes road work and construction season. For 2024, the City of Evans has budgeted a total of \$1,450,000 for roadway maintenance projects which include concrete replacement work (pictured above from March in the Platte Valley neighborhood due east of Centennial Elementary School) as well as asphalt patching, asphalt surface treatment, crack seal and mill and overlay work. Over the course of the next few months, these types of projects will be undertaken in neighborhoods across the City. Maintenance projects like these - funded in part by the 1% road tax - serve to not only improve road conditions but are also aid pavement preservation, saving the City, and thus the taxpayers, enormous sums of money in the long run.

Next Phase of 37th Street Widening Project to begin in April!

Beginning this month, the next phase of the 37th Street widening project will begin. This year's work will see 37th Street widened to two lanes in both directions between Sienna Avenue to Stampede Drive, beginning where the project ended last year. The roadway will be redone in its entire one-half mile stretch to a four-lane modern arterial roadway with a landscaped median irrigated with non-potable water. The project will also include some underground utility work including the lowering of some of the Atmos gas lines and the construction of a storm sewer. This project is the next step in a major redesign of the main east-west thoroughfare in our City.

The City of Evans Engineering Division estimates the project will be completed by September but believe the roadway will be open in both directions for the majority of the timeframe. At times, however, 37th Street will have to be closed to just one lane with flaggers controlling traffic and thus residents are asked to take alternate routes if possible. We further ask that travelers remain patient during the project; we know road construction can be an inconvenience but we're sure this project will be well worth the temporary traveling delays it may cause.



Outdoor Street Lighting How to report a Street Light Outage



What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example



Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.

FIRST: Select the Outages icon at the top of the page as indicated below

NEXT: Scroll to the bottom of the page and look for Outdoor lighting Outages and click on REPORT AN OUTDOOR OUTAGE as seen below



Finally: Enter your information.

- 1. Your name
- Your email address: This is used to inform you when the light is repaired.
- Contact phone number: This will be used to contact you should we have any questions regarding your repair request.

Pole information: ****If an outdoor lighting pole is broken, please call Xcel Energy Customer Care at 1-800-895-4999.

- Select the problem with the light
- 2. Pole number: This is where you would enter the two over two or three over three numbers on the pole.
- 3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can.
- 4. Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

Lastly: You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button.

Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed.

***Please note: Repairs are made in 5 business days unless there is more than routine maintenance is required.
