



49th Street Culvert Repair Project Now Complete - Roadway open to all traffic east of 35th Avenue.

The City of Evans is pleased to announce that 49th Street east of 35th Avenue has been reopened as of February 25th to all traffic following the completion of the infrastructure repair project that was necessary after a culvert collapse last spring.

Motorists traveling through the area will notice temporary jersey barriers installed along the north and south shoulders of the roadway. These barriers have been placed as a safety precaution.

The roadway in this area is poorly lit at night and can be prone to icy conditions during cold weather; the barriers help protect the traveling public while the city prepares to install permanent guardrails in the near future. See **page 2** for more information about this project.

Atmos Energy completes natural gas main installation early, 37th Street fully reopened to through traffic between 47th and 65th Avenues

The Atmos Energy project to install a new, larger natural gas main to meet increased demand in the area that resulted in the closure of 37th Street between 47th and 65th Avenues has been completed nearly two months early. We are grateful to Atmos Energy and their construction contractors who worked hard to get this projected completed and this major roadway reopened nearly two months earlier than initially forecast. Some work along the south shoulder of 37th Street east of 47th Avenue will continue with occasional lane closures in the area but no full closures are expected.

Council approves contract for gateway sign installation at Evans Junction

The Evans City Council held only one meeting in February and in that meeting approved a contract with Integrated Sign Services for the installation of a gateway sign, the concept of which is shown to the left, at the Highway 85 / 31st Street intersection known as the Evans Junction property. This is a key component of long-term city beautification plans, helping to establish city identity that will attract future business and investment in Evans.

(continued from Page 1): Why the Road Was Closed

The roadway was closed for approximately 10 months after a culvert failure beneath 49th Street last April. What initially appeared to be a straightforward repair quickly proved to be far more complex.

Several sensitive underground utilities were located in the immediate vicinity of the failed culvert, which meant the repair work required careful planning and advanced engineering to avoid service disruptions. In addition, crews needed to ensure the new structure would provide long-term durability and reliability. Another significant factor was the Evans Ditch, whose water decree is conveyed through the culvert under 49th Street. The repair work required the ditch to be completely free of water, but shutting off the ditch was not possible until mid-October when irrigation season ended. The ditch supplies water to residential, industrial, and agricultural users downstream, making it essential that repairs be carefully coordinated with the irrigation schedule.



A Long-Term Investment in Infrastructure

The final design and construction represented a collaborative effort between the City of Evans Engineering and Public Works teams, Kimley-Horn, and Mountain Constructors. The result is a high-quality infrastructure improvement that strengthens a critical roadway connection, ensuring reliable ditch service and will serve the community's needs for decades to come. The City of Evans appreciates the patience of residents and travelers during the extended closure and thanks the project partners and staff who worked diligently to complete this complex repair safely and successfully.

Evans Sign Shop in High Gear

The City of Evans' in-house sign shop is hard at work improving signage across the community, helping make our streets safer, easier to navigate, and more visually consistent citywide. By producing and installing signs locally, the city is able to respond quickly to maintenance needs while ensuring signage meets all required standards.

The process begins at the Operations Complex where the Evans' Sign Technician fabricates street signs, stop signs, speed limit signs, and other roadway signage. Once the signs are produced, she works alongside Public Works-Streets crews to install them throughout the community. As part of the process, old and damaged signs are responsibly recycled.



New signs being installed along 37th Street, moving west to east.


Crews are currently installing new signage along 37th Street, beginning at 65th Avenue and moving west to east toward 1st Avenue. Work on this corridor is approximately halfway complete. After finishing 37th Street, crews will shift their efforts to 42nd Street, followed by the main north-south arterial roadways. The city is prioritizing its busiest roadways first before moving to collector streets and neighborhood areas.



Maintaining an in-house Sign Shop represents a smart and responsible use of taxpayer dollars. Producing signage internally allows the city to complete work faster, manufacture signs to precise specifications, and reduce costs that would otherwise be associated with contracting the work externally.

The updated signage provides several important benefits for the community, including improved public safety, easier navigation for residents and visitors, compliance with retro-reflectivity standards for nighttime visibility, and a cleaner, more uniform appearance throughout the city. Standardized signage also reinforces the city's visual identity and branding.

This ongoing effort is another example of proactive maintenance and thoughtful investment in Evans' infrastructure—helping keep the community safe, functional, and moving forward.

The menu features a wide variety of options for breakfast lunch and dinner. Breakfast offerings include traditional American breakfasts, breakfast burritos, a breakfast quesadilla, pancakes, waffles, omelets, breakfast skillet, breakfast tortas and their signature Chilaquiles Frida (pictured).

Lunch options include salads, twelve different hamburger offerings, sandwiches, as well as traditional Mexican menu items such as tacos, smothered burritos, chimichangas, quesabirria tacos, enchiladas, chili relleno, tortas and more.

The dinner menu is also expansive, including chicken fried steak, rib eye steak, roast beef dinner, pork chops and fried fish.

Frida Café Bar and Grill has a full liquor license, and carries a selection of beer, wine, margaritas and much more. Check out the cantarito, which mixes tequila, fresh orange, lime, and grapefruit juices, topped with grapefruit soda, and served in a traditional clay cup.

Frida's also offers catering for events and has a food truck permanently located at 102 N. 8th Avenue in Greeley.



10 Cold Weather Tips



Bring pets indoors

Your pet's fur coat is not enough to keep them warm when temps drop, keep them indoors to prevent frostbite, hypothermia, and other serious cold-related injuries.



Prepare your vehicle

Check your tire pressure and fluids, pack jumper cables, make sure you have extra warm clothing or a blanket inside your car, charge your phone before leaving.



Exercise extreme caution on frozen water

Ice must be at least 4-inches thick to support an average person and at least 6-inches thick to support a snowmobile.



Open cabinets against exterior to warm pipes

Open cabinets under sinks that are against exterior walls to allow heat from indoors to prevent pipes from freezing.



Use a hairdryer to slowly warm frozen pipes

Never use a blow torch or open flame to thaw a frozen pipe; use a hairdryer instead. Make sure everyone in the home knows how to shut off the home's main water supply.



Wear a warm hat when outdoors

Wearing a warm hat in frigid weather helps prevent heat loss and protects you from dangerous cold-related conditions.



Use space heaters wisely

Follow manufacture's instructions when using a space heater, keep all items at least 5-feet away and never leave unattended.



Dress children in multiple layers with hats and gloves/mittens

Children's bodies get colder more quickly than adults and their skin is more sensitive to frostbite - heavy coats, hats and gloves or mittens are a must when going outdoors.



Disconnect outdoor hoses

Ensure outdoor hoses are disconnected from the exterior faucet to prevent indoor pipes from freezing.



Install a carbon monoxide detector

If you don't have one, install a carbon monoxide detector; ensure the ones you do have are functioning properly with new batteries.





Different building permit types have different fees associated with them. These fees go into separate accounts to help us complete City projects:

- All permits include the building fee, admin fee and use tax. These fees go into the general fund which can be used for projects like road maintenance. The building fee and use tax are calculated by the valuation of the project.
- Many permit types include a plan review fee for our team to check the submitted plans and ensure all of the proposed work is in line with our current building and land use codes, as well as engineering specs and standards.
- Permits for new primary construction will have impact and system development fees. These fees go into specific accounts for future expansion and impact on systems. For example, street impact fees are calculated by the impact that specific new construction type will have, and will go into an account to be used for upcoming roadway expansion. These fees are typically updated by a small percent each year.

The plastic water bottles you recycle can be made into thread for fabric used to make clothing, backpacks, sneakers and more.

The aluminum beverage cans you recycle today will be back on the shelf as a new can in about 60 days.

How to report a Street Light Outage



What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example




Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.


Where to report a Street light Outage?

FIRST: Select the Outages icon at the top of the page as indicated below



NEXT: Scroll to the bottom of the page and look for **Outdoor lighting Outages** and click on **REPORT AN OUTDOOR OUTAGE** as seen below



Next: Click on **Report it now** →

Finally: Enter your information.

1. Your name
2. Your email address: This is used to inform you when the light is repaired.
3. Contact phone number: This will be used to contact you should we have any questions regarding your repair request.

Pole information: ****If an outdoor lighting pole is broken, please call Xcel Energy Customer Care at 1-800-895-4999.

1. Select the problem with the light
2. Pole number: This is where you would enter the two over two or three over three numbers on the pole.
3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can.
4. Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

Lastly: You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button.

Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed.

***Please note: Repairs are made in 5 business days unless there is more than routine maintenance is required.
