





## **37th Street Widening Project Complete!**

We are proud to announce that work on Phase 2B of the 37<sup>th</sup> Street widening project has been completed. With this latest phase complete, 37th Street now operates as a modern, four-lane arterial from the 47<sup>th</sup> Avenue intersection all the way to Highway 85. Completion of this project represents another significant step forward in the evolution to Evans into the community of choice in Northern Colorado. Thank you to everyone for their patience while this project was on-going and thank you as well to our general contractor, GLH Construction, and to RockSol for their construction management services.











On Nov. 4, State Representative Ryan Gonzalez was present to help officially open the new McDonalds restaurant at Evans Junction alongside representatives from the City of Evans, Evans Area Chamber of Commerce and other community leaders.



## City Council Update - October 2025

The big news from October from the Evans City Council was the approval of the 2026 operating and capital budget. While the budget was formally adopted in October, crafting the budget began much earlier in the year as the council discussed priorities, evaluated revenue estimates, and worked with city leadership to identify needs for both the short term and long term.

Increasing costs and the lowest mill levy in Weld County made for some tough decisions; all city departments were asked to submit 2026 budget requests that included a 5% (or greater) reduction in supplies and services requests from what was allocated in 2025. Overall, general fund revenue increased only 1%, or about \$101,000, from 2025.

Among the highlights, in 2026, the city will continue with the 37<sup>th</sup> Street expansion project, with \$5.621 million budgeted out of the Streets, Street Impact, and Road Tax funds, to complete the arterial expansion from 65<sup>th</sup> Avenue to Arrowhead Drive. \$525,000 is appropriated for a traffic signal at the 23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue / 42<sup>nd</sup> Street intersection, \$1.5 million is budgeted for engineering and design work for a full reconstruction of 49<sup>th</sup> Street, and there is a line item for \$1.6 million from the Water Fund to replace the Highway 85 water line between 32<sup>nd</sup> and 37<sup>th</sup> Streets.

The council also voted to forgo further participation in the Northern Integrated Supply Project (NISP) water rights agreement. Due to costs that have escalated from \$350 million to over \$2.7 billion for the project - which serves communities all over Northern Colorado - it was decided that further participation would likely cause untenable rate increases on city utility customers.

At the Evans City Council Meeting on October 7th, Chief Darlin recognized several members of the Evans Police Department with well-earned awards for their outstanding service and dedication to the community.

## City of Evans Major Projects Update

The foundation of the new Evans Police Station at 3819 Saint Vrain Street, directly south of and adjacent to the Evans Community Complex, is nearly complete. At the city council meeting on Nov. 3, a contract amendment with general contractor FCI Constructors locked in the quaranteed maximum price for the new facility at \$25,014,214, considerably below the \$35,000,000 that was budgeted. Construction has been progressing as planned and the project remains on target for completion in fall 2026.





The work on the full reconstruction of 42nd Street/Prairie View Drive is nearly complete. In October, after the eastbound lanes were completed and opened to through traffic, contractor Martin Marietta completed all needed utility and concrete work on westbound lanes before laying down the top mat of asphalt. Final striping and surveying will take place the first week of November and the roadway is expected to be opened no later than Nov. 14.



The installation of the new playground at Renaissance Park has been completed and the park will open in November.



At the heart of the program is the revitalization of brownfields—properties where real or perceived environmental challenges are hindering redevelopment. Through FREE environmental site assessments (ESAs) and customized planning support, the Evans Property Initiative empowers commercial and industrial property owners to turn underutilized sites into thriving community assets.

## Cold Weather Tips



According to the American Veterinary Medical
Association (AVMA), temperatures below just 45
degrees can cause health problems for some pets.
The AVMA states, "It's a common belief that dogs and
cats are more resistant than people to cold weather
because of their fur, but it's untrue. Like people, cats and
dogs are susceptible to frostbite and hypothermia and
generally should be kept inside. Longer-haired and
thick-coated dog breeds, such as huskies and other
dogs bred for colder climates, are more tolerant of cold
weather; but no pet should be left outside for long
periods in below-freezing weather."

Other cold weather pet protection tips from the AVMA
include wiping off your dogs paws as well as their chest

include wiping off your dogs paws, as well as their chest and belly for short-legged dogs, after walks as they could pick up dangerous de-icing chemicals from the ground. Make sure your dog has a collar and is microchipped as if they wander away, cold and snow can limit their sense of smell and thus their ability to potentially find their way back home if lost.

With cold temperatures here, the Evans Police Department is reminding residents to make their vehicles a hard target for theft.

During winter months, car thieves often target "puffers," or vehicles left running and unattended as they warm up. This nickname stems from the puff of the exhaust visible during cold weather. Thieves often search for puffers because they are easy targets and then use these stolen cars to commit other crimes.

In Colorado, puffing is Class B traffic infraction. This means that in addition to being the victim of a theft, a vehicle owner can be fined for leaving their car running while unattended. The only exception to this law relates to vehicles with a remote ignition system. The Evans Police Department is asking residents to either (1) stay with their vehicle when it's warming up or (2) use a remote start, lock the doors, and take the key with them.

## **Thefts From Vehicles Increasing**



The **Evans Police Department** has seen a noticeable uptick in thefts from parked cars recently. In the some of the cases, the vehicles were locked, and the thieves broke into the car to remove personal items. In the majority of cases, however, the vehicles were left unlocked,

allowing the thieves to simply help themselves to whatever items of value they could find in the vehicles. The most frequent types of personal items stolen include wallets, purses, car stereos, driver's licenses, insurance and registration documents, laptop computers, cell phones, license plates and garage door opener remotes which can later be used to access the home. Not only is

the theft of personal items difficult for the victim, but many of these stolen items can be used in the commission of other, often times more serious, crimes including credit card fraud and identity theft, to name a few.

Criminal vehicle trespass, more commonly called car break-ins, usually occur in clusters within neighborhoods. Thieves will target a specific neighborhood one night and the next night or a few nights later, move on and hit other neighborhoods. The result is that cars parked anywhere throughout the City can become targets for theft.

While this type of crime is disturbing and the Evans PD is doing all they car to prevent thefts, the good news is there are a lot of easy, common sense actions residents and their visitors can take to reduce the chances of becoming a victim.

## The Evans Police Department is encouraging residents to:

- Lock your car doors and seal your windows. As simple as it sounds, you would be surprised how many thefts occur from vehicles left unlocked or with the windows open overnight.
- Use all the safety features with which your vehicle is equipped.
   Make sure to activate your alarm and investigate quickly if you hear your car alarm go off while you are away from it.
- Do not leave anything of value in your car. Leaving your purse or wallet, cell phone or laptop, your golf clubs or gym bag in plain view makes it an easy target for thieves. Even a zipped-up gym bag or backpack can be tempting for a thief as they cannot be sure if the bag contains dirty exercise clothes or something far more valuable like your bankbook, membership cards, small entertainment devices or expensive tools.
- Park in a well-lit, secure area visible to others. Thieves prefer to break into vehicles parked in dark and secluded areas and avoid welllet areas as much as possible.
- Form a neighborhood watch group. Banding together with your neighbors helps provide cover for when you, or your neighbors, are away. See page 6 for more.
- Report the Crime. If you do find yourself a victim, report the crime immediately to the Evans PD.









The weather is getting chilly and it's time to get cozy by the fireplace! If you are looking to add a wood burning stove or fireplace insert to your home, here are some tips to stay warm and safe:

- A permit is required to install a woodburning stove or fireplace insert.
- Wood burning stove and fireplace installation codes are heavily dictated by the particular manufacturer and their required venting. Ensure the work is inspected by a City inspector.
- Portable/non-permanent "fireplaces" and heaters do not require permits but do have safety measures to follow.
- Always make certain your home has working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Have fireplaces, chimneys and other venting inspected and cleaned regularly.





## Outdoor Street Lighting How to report a Street Light Outage



#### What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example



Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.



FIRST: Select the Outages icon at the top of the page as indicated below



NEXT: Scroll to the bottom of the page and look for Outdoor lighting Outages and click on REPORT AN OUTDOOR OUTAGE as seen below



Finally: Enter your information.

- 1. Your name
- 2. Your email address: This is used to inform you when the light is repaired.
- 3. Contact phone number: This will be used to contact you should we have any questions regarding your repair request.

Pole information: \*\*\*\*If an outdoor lighting pole is broken, please call Xcel Energy Customer Care at 1-800-895-4999.

- 1. Select the problem with the light
- Pole number: This is where you would enter the two over two or three over three numbers on the pole.
- 3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can.
- Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

Lastly: You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button.

Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed.

\*\*\*Please note: Repairs are made in 5 business days unless there is more than routine maintenance is required.
