

City Council Update - November 2025

In November, the Evans City Council approved a pair of measures that will have a considerable public impact. The council voted unanimously to approve a contract amendment with FCI Constructors, the general contractor for the new Evans Police Station, to lock in the guaranteed maximum price of \$24,289,214 to construct the new police station and to renovate the existing space used by police in the northeastern portion of the Evans Community Complex for use by city administration. This price is considerably below the \$35 million budgeted from the domestic food tax fund and represents a substantial savings for tax payers.

The Council also voted unanimously to approve a contract with Mountain Constructors to complete the culvert replacement and road repair on 49th Street near 35th Avenue. The contract requires the project to be completed in a condensed timeframe – full completion on or before March 15, 2026 – so the Evans Ditch can convey the full decree of water as irrigation season begins. Work will begin in mid-December and 49th Street will remain closed until the project is completed.

The council also received a lengthy and detailed update from the city's Public Works & Utilities Director regarding the need to address deferred maintenance that is impacting ditch water supply to East Evans and Riverside Park. In short, a lateral that conveys the water is failing across a considerable segment and will require a further investigation before determining the scope of required repairs. Initial estimates indicate that repairs could range from \$650,000 to over \$6 million; a clearer picture will be available in the near future.





During the November 18th City Council Meeting, the Evans Police Department held a promotional ceremony recognizing three recent promotions.

Rob Wardlaw and Jon Trahan were each promoted to the rank of Commander.

Commander Wardlaw will oversee Patrol Operations, while Commander Trahan will

oversee Administrative Operations.

Todd Ediger was promoted to the rank of Sergeant.

City of Evans Major Projects Update



On Nov. 19, the city hosted a grand opening ceremony at Renaissance Park to celebrate the completion of the new playground at Renaissance Park, the completion of the brand new Hunter's Reserve Park, the first phase of the Evans Ditch Trail and completion of Arrowhead Open Space. Mayor Mark Clark (center) was joined by Councilmen Jeff Crabtree (left) and Chris Delaney as they cut the ribbon to officially open the park. The City of Evans has invested revenue from Park Impact Fees from new development and Conservation Trust proceeds from the Colorado Lottery to build these new parks, open space, and trail amenities. Investments like these improve quality of life for residents, provide opportunities for people of all ages to participate in healthy activities, raise property values, help attract new development, and improve the overall aesthetics of our community.

In April, a culvert that conveys water from the Evans Ditch under 49th Street in the vicinity of 35th Avenue suffered a catastrophic failure forcing a road closure. At the Evans City Council meeting on Nov. 3, unanimous approval was given to a contract with Mountain Constructors for the needed repairs that will replace the culvert and construct a new roadway segment. Final design work will be completed in the coming weeks with work to begin immediately afterwards. A contractually obligated completion date is set on or before March 15, 2026. Thank you for your patience and understanding.







Construction of the new Evans Police Station is progressing rapidly and as planned. The foundation has been laid and soon construction will be going vertical. FCI Constructors, the general contractor for the project, will be working regardless of the weather and we plan to open next fall!



INTRODUCING THE EVANS PROPERTY INITIATIVE: TRANSFORMING THE HIGHWAY 85 CORRIDOR

The City of Evans is thrilled to launch the Evans Property Initiative, an exciting effort to revitalize the U.S. Highway 85 Corridor through environmental assessment, planning support, and economic development. Thanks to a \$500,000 Community-wide Assessment Grant from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), this initiative provides commercial and industrial property owners with the resources they need to unlock new opportunities for growth and investment.

At the heart of the program is the revitalization of brownfields—properties where real or perceived environmental challenges are hindering redevelopment. Through FREE environmental site assessments (ESAs) and customized planning support, the Evans Property Initiative empowers commercial and industrial property owners to turn underutilized sites into thriving community assets.

Cold Weather Tips



According to the American Veterinary Medical
Association (AVMA), temperatures below just 45
degrees can cause health problems for some pets.
The AVMA states, "It's a common belief that dogs and
cats are more resistant than people to cold weather
because of their fur, but it's untrue. Like people, cats and
dogs are susceptible to frostbite and hypothermia and
generally should be kept inside. Longer-haired and
thick-coated dog breeds, such as huskies and other
dogs bred for colder climates, are more tolerant of cold
weather; but no pet should be left outside for long
periods in below-freezing weather."
Other cold weather pet protection tips from the AVMA

include wiping off your dogs paws, as well as their chest and belly for short-legged dogs, after walks as they could pick up dangerous de-icing chemicals from the ground. Make sure your dog has a collar and is microchipped as if they wander away, cold and snow can limit their sense of smell and thus their ability to potentially find their way back home if lost.

With cold temperatures here, the Evans Police Department is reminding residents to make their vehicles a hard target for theft.

During winter months, car thieves often target "puffers," or vehicles left running and unattended as they warm up. This nickname stems from the puff of the exhaust visible during cold weather. Thieves often search for puffers because they are easy targets and then use these stolen cars to commit other crimes.

In Colorado, puffing is Class B traffic infraction. This means that in addition to being the victim of a theft, a vehicle owner can be fined for leaving their car running while unattended. The only exception to this law relates to vehicles with a remote ignition system. The Evans Police Department is asking residents to either (1) stay with their vehicle when it's warming up or (2) use a remote start, lock the doors, and take the key with them.



The City of Evans wants you to stay warm this winter! However there are a few reasons that gas may be shut off, including when Atmos detects a leak. Here is how to get your gas turned back on quickly and safely:

- A <u>plumber</u> should complete a pressure test and leave the gas line on the "TEST" status
- A permit must be obtained for a City inspector to then inspect the "TEST" status (the City inspector will not perform the test itself).
- The permit has a flat fee of \$57.50 and can be obtained in just a few minutes via our online portal with Citizenserve.
- Same day inspections must be requested prior to 5pm. Inspections are completed as quickly as possible, however same day inspections are not always guaranteed.
- Once the inspection has passed, either the homeowner or plumber must contact Atmos to have the gas turned back on.

Through the Fixture Replacement Program, the City of Evans helps homeowners upgrade to high-efficiency fixtures for free!



DID YOU KNOW: A landfill is where the materials you put in the trash are taken to be disposed. 

Outdoor Street Lighting How to report a Street Light Outage



What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example



Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.



FIRST: Select the Outages icon at the top of the page as indicated below



NEXT: Scroll to the bottom of the page and look for Outdoor lighting Outages and click on REPORT AN OUTDOOR OUTAGE as seen below



Finally: Enter your information.

- 1. Your name
- 2. Your email address: This is used to inform you when the light is repaired.
- 3. Contact phone number: This will be used to contact you should we have any questions regarding your repair request.

- 3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can.
- Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

Lastly: You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button.

Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed.
