Council Approves Ordinance to Require Permitting for Garage Sales

The Evans City Council approved an ordinance at the May 19 meeting reestablishing the requirement for residents to obtain a permit from the City of Evans for hosting a garage sale. The permit, which can be obtained from the Evans City Clerks Office will be available at **no charge** to residents and will require only basic information including the name and address of the applicant, date(s) of the garage sale, a brief description of items to be offered for sale, and a statement as to how the goods that are for sale were originally acquired. Furthermore, the new ordinance prohibits placing signs advertising the garage sale on traffic signs or poles, traffic light poles, or on property of persons other than those holding the sale. Further information will be available on this topic in June.



Evans Project Updates - 37th Street Lights

A Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued on January 14, 2026, with a closing date of February 4, 2026. The City received four proposals and selected Kimley-Horn as the preferred consultant.

The protest period has concluded without any formal protests, and the design contract was executed on March 17, 2026 in the amount of \$67,450.

According to an April 9 lighting design memo by Kimley-Horn, it is projected that a 30% design submittal will be completed by late May or early June 2026.

The project includes the design of street lighting along 37th Street between 35th Avenue and 47th Avenue to improve safety and visibility. A separate photometric study will also be conducted along 47th Avenue, from the roundabout north to the city limits. This study is not included in the contract price and will be negotiated separately.

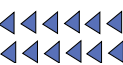

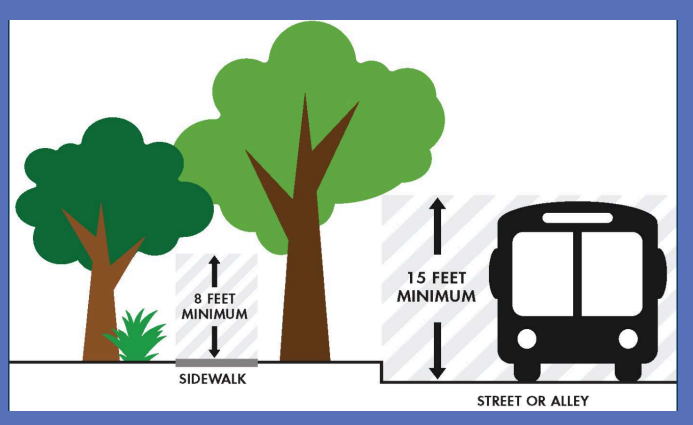

Building Bulletin

The weather is getting warmer and it's time to enjoy the outdoors! For many homeowners that may mean building a deck. Here is a how-to to help get your deck permitted and ready for those summer bbq's:

- Most decks require a building permit
- The application for the permit should include a plot plan showing our team how it will meet setback requirements and plans showing us how the deck will be constructed, including whether it is covered or uncovered
- If a contractor is performing the work, they will need to have a current business license and submit the application into Citizenserve
- Homeowners performing their own work will also need to submit the permit application in Citizenserve
- Once the permit application has been approved, the applicant can start work and call in for inspections along the way

Please note, sprinkler cycle and soak can help increase efficiency and reduce runoff. Run 2-3 cycles 45-60 minutes apart with the total run time for the day equal the duration recommended in the table above.

*Please note that these are recommended run times for our region, if your lawn is suffering at these recommended run times please adjust time and cycles accordingly. Alternatively, if you water less than this and your lawn is healthy, do not water more than needed.

The City of Evans has Outdoor Watering Policies effective between April 15 and October 15.

Outdoor watering is allowed on scheduled days except between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

- Single-family homes with even-numbered addresses shall only use outdoor irrigation on Sunday, Tuesday, and Thursday of each week.
- Single-family homes with odd-numbered addresses shall only use outdoor irrigation on Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday of each week.
- All other properties including commercial, multi-family residences, apartments, government, and nonprofit organizations shall only use outdoor irrigation on Sunday, Tuesday and Friday of each week.

RECYCLING IS REAL



Bottle = Shirt

The plastic water bottles you recycle can be made into thread for fabric used to make clothing, backpacks, sneakers and more.



Paper = Paperboard

The clean paper you recycle is pulped and made into paperboard packaging for cereal, crackers and other household goods.



Jug = Carpet

The thick multi-gallon plastic water jugs you recycle can be made into carpet for homes and businesses.



Can = Can

The aluminum beverage cans you recycle today will be back on the shelf as a new can in about 60 days.



RECYCLE RIGHT

Only place the following in your recycle cart

- Clean cardboard
- Paper
- Metal cans
- Glass bottles and jars
- Plastic containers shaped like bottles, jars, jugs and tubs.



Do **NOT** put any of these items in your recycle cart

- Food or liquids
- Plastic bags
- Batteries, electronics
- Clothing or carpet
- Paper towels, cups, napkins or plates
- Concrete or wood
- Styrofoam, scrap metal
- Yard waste

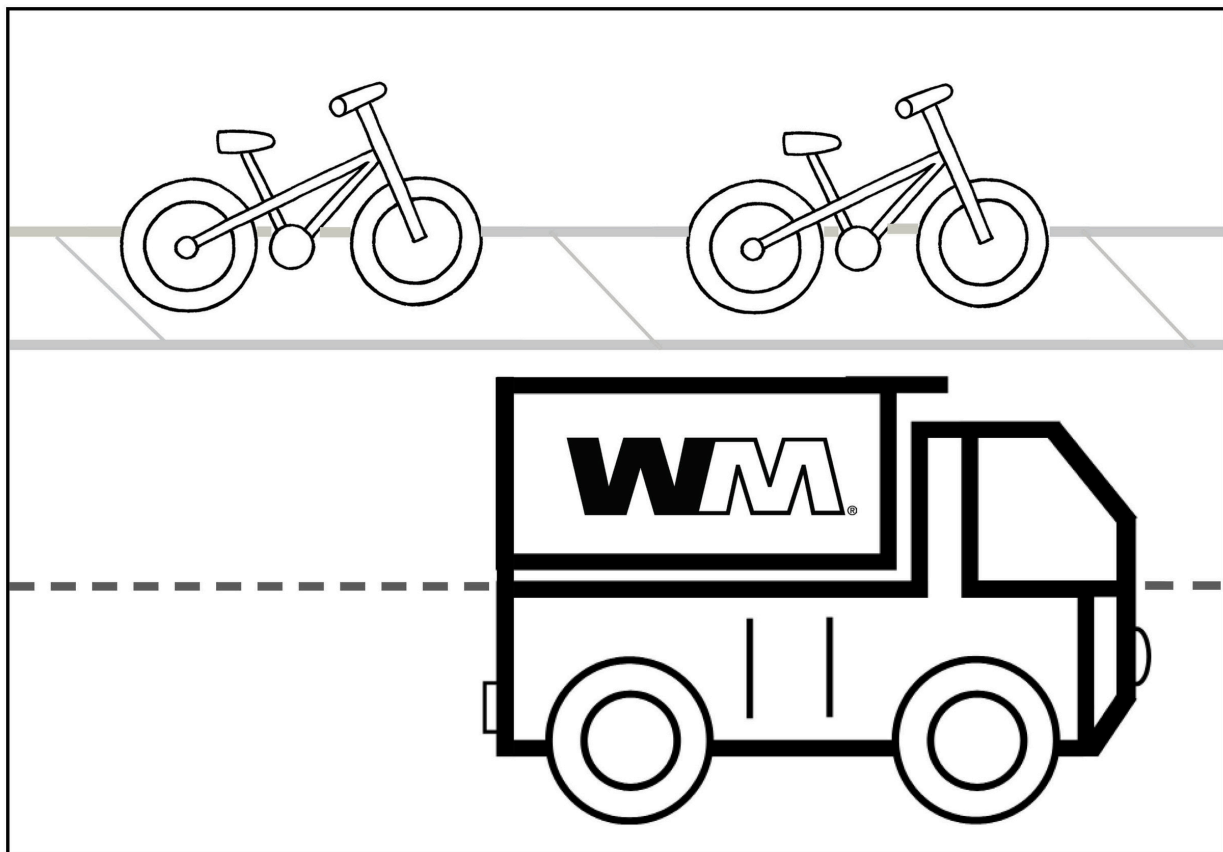

How to report a Street Light Outage



What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example



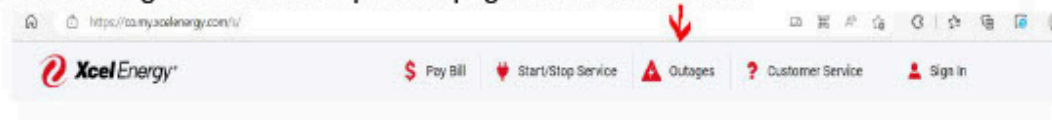
Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.

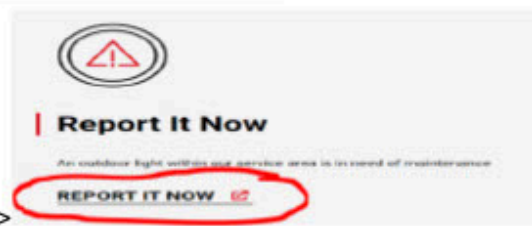

FIRST: Select the Outages icon at the top of the page as indicated below



NEXT: Scroll to the bottom of the page and look for **Outdoor lighting Outages** and click on **REPORT AN OUTDOOR OUTAGE** as seen below



Next: Click on **Report it now** →

Finally: Enter your information.

1. Your name
2. Your email address: This is used to inform you when the light is repaired.
3. Contact phone number: This will be used to contact you should we have any questions regarding your repair request.

Pole information: ****If an outdoor lighting pole is broken, please call Xcel Energy Customer Care at 1-800-895-4999.

1. Select the problem with the light
2. Pole number: This is where you would enter the two over two or three over three numbers on the pole.
3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can.
4. Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

Lastly: You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button.

Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed.

***Please note: Repairs are made in 5 business days unless there is more than routine maintenance is required.
