

'Tis the season for infrastructure improvements! The City of Evans will hold a trio of town halls in December, including one presentation in Spanish. All meetings will be held at the Evans Community Complex and will be held at the following dates and times.

Resident input is a high priority. City leaders are seeking feedback on the condition of the streets and the planned development within the community.

"Many residents don't understand the power that they have in local government," Evans City Manager Jim Becklenberg, said. "We value our residents' input because it's their city and we want their ideas to shape their community."



FOR MANY RESIDENTS, STREET REPAIR AND INFRASTRUCTURE IS THEIR PRIMARY CONCERN

"It's sporadic. Stampede was good. Certain parts of 37th (Street) are good. But west of 35th (Ave), it's a mess. Some of the residential areas within Ashcroft are really bad." Evans resident Carol LeMay, said. "Overall, I would give the street rating, 1-out-of-10, a 6."

Jim Becklenberg

City Manager Jim Becklenberg appeared on KFKA Radio in November with host Gail Fallen. He covered a variety of topics, including the city's infrastructure needs and Fallen asked about the city's priorities heading into 2020.

"The biggest challenge we have is keeping up with the infrastructure," Becklenberg said. "We're trying to do what we can with the revenue we have to keep up so that we don't experience the type of traffic jams and problems that we do have (in Colorado)."

The Road Ahead looks promising for the City of Evans. Several infrastructure and street projects have been completed in 2019, with more upgrades in the blueprints for 2020.



New Streetlights, irrigation installed at 35th Avenue | Complete



The 35th Avenue widening project was effectively complete in mid-August. All lanes opened to traffic and the road is fully functional. In addition to the primary infrastructure, new streetlights have been installed along with irrigation. Landscaping will continue into 2020.



Striping scheduled for the 2019 Surface Treatment Project | Complete



The 2019 Asphalt Surface Treatment launched on September 25, 2019. The project restored, renewed, and increased the longevity of asphalt on strategic streets in the City of Evans. The project included three arterial roadways and three collector streets in six priority areas.



Road open at 31st St. & HWY 85 | Complete



The road is open at 31st St. & HWY 85 and striping is scheduled for completion in mid-November. The project is anticipated to be complete by the end of November. The 31st St. & HWY 85 Access Control project broke ground in August of 2019 with the goal of enhancing safety and signal timing at the intersection of 31st Street and US Highway 85.



Evans first roundabout planned at 37th St. & 47th Ave | In-Progress

The City is in the design phase of widening 37th Street from 35th Avenue west to 65th Avenue as well as 47th Avenue north of 37th Street. As of November 2019, 30% of the plans have been reviewed and design is proceeding. Evans 1st roundabout Construction of the first phase, 47th Avenue, will take place next year.



37th Street Utilities Project & Overlay | In-Progress

The 37th Street Utilities Project is expected to be complete by end of 2019 or early 2020. Following the installation of the underground utilities, the City will begin installing a brand new surface to the thoroughfare. The 37th Street Utilities Project broke ground in May of 2019 with the goal of replacing aging underground utilities before repaving the road in 2020. The project is progressing in four stages: sanitary sewer replacement, water line replacement, storm sewer replacement, and finally a new surface for the road. The utility work is planned to be completed by the end of 2019 with a new surface on 37th Street from 23rd Avenue east to the railroad constructed in 2020.



23rd Ave, 2-Lane Extension | In-Progress

A brand new road is in the blueprints at 23rd Ave and 37th Street. The City will construct 2-lanes of 23rd Avenue south from 37th Street to 42nd Street next year. This will provide another entry and exit point for new developments in the corridor. The road will be further expanded to a four-lane arterial standard in the coming years as the area develops.

INFORME DE INFRAESTRUCTURA | CIUDAD DE EVANS

El camino adelante es prometedor para la Ciudad de Evans. Varias obras infraestructurales y de vías y servicios públicos se han completado en el 2019, con avances adicionales planeados para 2020.

**Nuevas farolas, Riego Instalado en la Avenida 35 | Completa**

El proyecto de ampliación de la avenida 35 se completó efectivamente a mediados de agosto. Todos los carriles se abrieron al tráfico y el camino es completamente funcional. Además de la infraestructura primaria, se han instalado nuevas farolas junto con riego. Paisajismo continuará en 2020

**Rayado Fijado para el Proyecto de Tratamiento de Superficie 2019 | Completa**

El tratamiento de superficie de asfalto de 2019 se lanzó el 25 de septiembre de 2019. El proyecto restauró, renovó y aumentó la longevidad del asfalto en calles estratégicas de la ciudad de Evans. El proyecto incluyó tres vías arteriales y tres calles colectoras en seis áreas prioritarias

**Primera Rotonda de Evans Prevista en la Calle 37 y Avenida 47 | Completa**

La ciudad está en la fase de diseño de ampliar la calle 37 desde la avenida 35 oeste hacia la avenida 65, así como la avenida 47 al norte de la calle 37. A noviembre de 2019, el 30% de los planes han sido revisados y el diseño está en curso. Evans primera ronda La construcción de la primera fase, avenida 47th, se llevará a cabo el próximo año.

**Obra de Servicios Públicos y Repavimentación calle 37 | En Proceso**

Se espera que la obra de Servicios Públicos de la calle 37 se complete para fines de 2019 o principios de 2020. Luego de la instalación de los servicios públicos subterráneos, la Ciudad comenzará a instalar una superficie completamente nueva en la vía pública. El Proyecto de Servicios Públicos de la calle 37 se inició en mayo de 2019 con el objetivo de reemplazar los servicios públicos subterráneos viejos antes de repavimentar la carretera en 2020. El proyecto está progresando en cuatro etapas: reemplazo de alcantarillado sanitario, reemplazo de la línea de agua, reemplazo de alcantarillado pluvial y finalmente un nuevo superficie para el camino. Está previsto que el trabajo de servicios públicos se complete a fines de 2019 con una nueva superficie en la calle 37 desde la avenida 23 este hasta el ferrocarril construido en 2020.

**Calle 31 y Carretera 85 Abierto | En Proceso**

El camino está abierto en la calle 31 y carretera 85 y se espera que el trazado de líneas finalice a mediados de noviembre. Se espera que el proyecto se complete a fines de noviembre. El proyecto de control de acceso de la calle 31 y carretera 85 se inició en agosto de 2019 con el objetivo de mejorar la seguridad y la sincronización de los semáforos en la intersección de la Calle 31 y Carretera 85.

**Avenida 23, Extensión de 2 carriles | En Proceso**

Una calle nueva está en los planos en la Avenida 23rd y Calle 37th. La ciudad construirá 2 carriles de la avenida 23 sur desde la calle 37 hasta la calle 42 el próximo año. Esto proporcionará otro punto de entrada y salida para nuevos desarrollos en el corredor. El camino se ampliará aún más a un estándar arterial de cuatro carriles en los próximos años a medida que se desarrolle el área.

Candidates must return their petitions in person to the Evans City Clerk's Office by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 27th.

Ward 1 – 4 year term



Position Overview

The City of Evans is seeking an experienced command-level officer to serve as a member of a collaborative team to pave the way for future community success. The Police Commander leads a team of up to 41 full-time staff, both sworn and non-sworn. The Police Department is comprised of Patrol Services, Investigations, Traffic Safety Unit, School Resource Officer, and Animal Control/Community Service Technician. The department also participates in the regional drug task force and the regional SWAT team. There are both a full-service Records Unit and a Property and Evidence Section. The Police Commander will perform advanced and complex professional duties such as budget analysis, staffing assessments, evaluating performance measurements, and will produce any number of reports and recommendations to the chief of police. The position is also responsible for maintaining strong relationships with other police staff, other departments within the City and with the residents and business community. The Police Commander will partner with staff, residents, stakeholders, city management and Council to build consensus to carry out the strategic priorities of the department.

Ideal Candidate

In addition to being ethical, well qualified and experienced, the next Police Commander must possess certain traits that will be essential for success:

- A seasoned professional who has knowledge of and experience in both the operational and administrative functions within a full-service police agency. The commander must gain and maintain respect from staff, City Council and the community.
- An accomplished leader who can provide clear direction, coaching, and mentoring to staff.
- A strong collaborator and team player who builds strong working relationships with other staff, community and regional partners.
- A politically-savvy police professional who knows how to remain calm and navigate sensitive issues in an appropriate and tactful manner that promotes community interests.
- A working professional who ensures that high levels of accountability, responsiveness and customer service are provided by staff throughout the department, with the ability to prioritize tasks, work well under pressure, and handle a high volume of work.
- A creative problem solver who understands the links between the community and the criminal justice system.

Evans Celebrates 150 Years:

The Bloody Dispute Between Harry Woodbury and W.D. French


On December 15th, 1888, a heated dispute between Evans residents and business partners, Harry Woodbury and Wilbur Dwight French, turned violent.

Harry Woodbury moved to Evans from Minnesota, and W.D. French came from Missouri. Woodbury was reportedly a shoemaker by trade, and French a wealthy cattle rancher. According to the Greeley History Museum's archives, Woodbury and French entered a professional partnership in 1887. The nature of their business relationship was short lived and largely unknown, but a disagreement between the two men would be the source of discussion for years to come.

When their business relationship dissolved Woodbury sold his share of the partnership and also agreed to provide French with 850 pounds of flour as part of their settlement. Woodbury brought 250 pounds of flour to French's home, and an intense argument erupted between the two men regarding the missing 600 pounds of flour that Woodbury owed. French was already known and disliked as a hothead in the area; in a 2013 article by the Greeley Tribune regarding the incident, they write that "French [was] already unpopular for reportedly abusing his wife, children, and others." On the night of December 15th, 1888, French allegedly took matters into his own hands and took Woodbury's life, breaking into his home and shooting him in cold blood.


French and two of his associates were taken into custody. Word spread quickly around town however that there may not be enough evidence to convict French of the murder. The townspeople, already on edge about French's past brash and violent behavior, were enraged by this possibility. On December 28th, 1888, "a mob of 100 Greeley and Evans men" formed a vigilante crew that broke into the Weld County Jail, dragged French from his cell, and hung him in a nearby tree. This marked the only lynching in Greeley/Evans history.

Photos, documents, and the rope used in the hanging are preserved by the Greeley History Museum for a project called, "Paper Trails: The Murder of Harry Woodbury and the Lynching of W.D. French in Greeley, CO."





2020 Census will be crucial for Evans and Weld County

Why It Matters

Hospitals. Fire departments. Schools. Even roads and highways. The census can shape many different aspects of your community. Each year, the results help determine how more than \$675 billion in federal funding is distributed to states and communities. It's also mandated by the Constitution: The U.S. has counted its population every 10 years since 1790.

What to Expect in 2020

By April 2020, households will receive an invitation to participate in the census. You'll then have three options to respond: online, by phone, or by mail. We'll mark Census Day on April 1, 2020, with events across the country. This is a key date for the 2020 count: When completing the census, you'll note where you are living on April 1.

Am I Required to Respond to the Census?

Yes, all people living in the United States, Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Guam, and the U.S. Virgin Islands are required by law to be counted in the 2020 Census.

Why It's Required

Getting a complete and accurate census count is critically important. That's why your response is required by law. If you do not respond, the U.S. Census Bureau will follow up in person to collect the information.

Why is the census so important? The results are used to determine how many seats your state gets in Congress. State and local officials also use census counts to draw boundaries for congressional districts, state legislative districts, and school districts.

And just as you are required by law to participate, the Census Bureau is bound by law to protect your answers. Your responses are used only to produce statistics. The Census Bureau does not disclose any personal information.

Starting in 2019, you may begin to notice census takers in your neighborhood. This is a normal part of the 2020 Census preparation and data collection process. Census field representatives will also continue to collect information for the American Community Survey (ACS) and other ongoing surveys.


