Know the Rules Regarding Fireworks in Evans

Illegal Fireworks

Fireworks that are aerial (leave the ground), fly through the air self-propelled, explode or fragment (bottle rockets) and similar more powerful fireworks are illegal in the State of Colorado as well as the City of Evans. This includes handling, possession, sale and storage within the City of Evans unless used in conjunction with an approved public fireworks display authorized by the Fire Department. There will be an increase in the presence of law enforcement on the streets heading into July 4th festivities. Let's all obey the law and honor your neighbors.

Illegal Fireworks Include:

- Bottle Rockets
- Missile Boxes
- Rockets and Shells
- Cherry bombs
- Firecrackers
- M-100 or M-80 devices
- Mortars
- Roman Candles
- Explosive devices
- Helicopters

Fireworks from this list often are the type Evans residents register complaints about, are illegal, and prohibited within city limits.

Handling, possession, sale or use of illegal fireworks is a violation of Evans Municipal Code 9.33.020 and is subject to issuance of a Evans Municipal Court Summons. Illegal Fireworks carries a maximum fine of up to \$2650.00 which may be imposed.

Permissible Fireworks

The intent of the fireworks ordinance is to allow Evans families to celebrate the July 4th holiday and not subject neighbors to undue noise disruption. Always supervise children and use caution. Permissible fireworks are "non-explosive" pyrotechnics that are not intended to leave the ground or create a loud noise and include:

- Cigarette loads
- Explosive auto alarms
- Ground spinners
- Sparklers
- Trick matches
- Cylindrical or cone fountains
- Glow worms
- Party poppers
- Toy Smoke Devices
- Noise makers

Protect Pets While Traveling

- Leave your pets at home if possible when you need to go out and about.
- Never leave a pet in the car, even in the shade or with windows cracked. Cars can overheat quickly to deadly temperatures, even when the weather isn't severe.


Good Samaritan "hot car" law protects people who break into hot cars to rescue at-risk people and animals.

There is a checklist people have to fulfill in order to not be charged as well:

1. The vehicle in question can't be a law enforcement vehicle.
2. An at-risk person or non-livestock animal has to be in the car and the Good Samaritan must believe that person or animal is in imminent danger of death or suffering serious bodily injury.
3. The vehicle must be locked.

Seek emergency veterinary care if you observe any of these warning signs:

- Anxiousness
- Excessive panting
- Restlessness
- Excessive drooling
- Unsteadiness
- Abnormal gum and tongue color
- Collapse



IDEAS TO KEEP PETS COMFORTABLE

- Talk to your veterinarian about warm weather risks for pets (and travel safety if you plan to travel with a pet).
- Make sure your pets have unlimited access to fresh water, and access to shade when outside.
- Don't walk or hike with a dog during the hottest parts of summer days.
- If it's hot outside for you, it's even hotter for your pet.
- Never leave dogs unattended in vehicles.
- Avoid hot surfaces, such as asphalt, that can burn your pet's paws.
- Ask your veterinarian if your pet would benefit from a warm-weather haircut or sunscreen.

What are the dates of the contest?

Photos will be accepted between March 1 and November 1, 2018.

All photos must be taken during that timeframe and taken within Evans City limits.

Winners will be announced at a reception in early December at the Riverside Library and Cultural Center.

All first and second place winners in each category will be on display following the announcement reception.

The display will remain up in the Riverside Library through January 31, 2019.

How do I submit photos?

What file formats will be accepted?

JPEG images will be the only format accepted for electronic submissions. The judging committee will determine size of printed image to be displayed based on best resolution.

What other rules are there?

Only images taken during the designated contest timeframe will be accepted.

Color or black & white images will be accepted.

All images need to have been taken in the City of Evans.

All images need to be appropriate in nature.

Photos will not be returned.

No selfies will be accepted.

All entries must be submitted with the entrants last name, first name and category for consideration.

(e.g. Doe, John, Water) In the case of multiple submissions in the same category, label the photos with last name, first name, category and number of entry. (e.g. Doe, John, Water 1; Doe, John, Water 2).

No tinted, pre-set, action or sepia images will be accepted.

No composite photos will be accepted.

All electronic submissions need to be submitted to info@evanscolorado.gov

Intellectual Property

Entry to the contest automatically gives the City of Evans permission to use entered photographs, along with your name and where the photo was taken in future publications, on their website, Facebook, Twitter and other social media venues, marketing and visual displays.

Are there prizes?

Each second place will receive a ribbon and a certificate and every first place will receive a ribbon, certificate and a cash prize of \$100 for each adult category winner and \$50 for each youth category winner. 




DAY 4 – J. Paul Getty Museum and the Queen Mary
