Heritage Day Shines in Evans

Heritage Day 2018 was a hit. Several thousand Evans' residents gathered at City Park for the annual festival in September.

2018's version of Evans' annual Heritage Day festival featured several new additions that stole the headlines, including a zip line and a camel. Kids were able to strap into a harness and glide down cable 50 feet in the air. Meanwhile, the camel was the star of the show at the petting zoo. Families lined-up for a chance to grab a selfie with the hump-backed creature.



"We think the zip line and the camel were a home run this year," Brian Stone, Evans Recreation Director said. "Kids loved the zebra in 2017, but the camel was just as popular as any animal we've ever had."

There was entertainment for everyone, including the annual parade and an all-day lineup of musical acts. The food was fantastic. Several food trucks served a variety of dishes, including barbecue, wings, and sweet treats like ice cream and snow cones.





IMPAIRED DRIVING DEMO

The Evans Police Department hosted an impaired driving course. Residents placed a virtual reality mask over their eyes that created the illusion of intoxication. The purpose of the impaired driving course was to educate the public about the dangers of impaired driving. Residents drove a golf cart through an obstacle course of orange cones with a Police Officer in the passenger seat. The golf carts did not reach a speed higher than 5 miles per hour.



"We always feel good if we can educate the public and have fun at the same time," Rick Brandt, Evans Police Chief said. "The impaired driving course is an eye-opener for many people. It really shows how dangerous it is to drive impaired. We hope it leaves a lasting impression on the people who participated. It could help save lives in the future."

Evans Police Provide Winter Coats For Kids In Need



Evans, CO – The Evans Police Department, along with the Greeley/Evans Moose Lodge and Evans PD FOP Lodge 64, raised \$566 to purchase 22 winter coats for kids in need. Evans Police Officers also donated an additional 20 coats. Altogether, more than 40 coats were distributed to Union Colony, Dos Rios, and Centennial Elementary schools in Evans. Each schools' administration will be selecting the children most in need of the coats.

Sam's Club provided an additional \$50 towards the purchase of winter coats. Another Evans' resident, who was shopping in Sam's Club at the same time of the purchase, donated \$50 to help keep kids warm this winter.

"It was neighbor helping neighbor," Evans Police Chief Rick Brandt said. "The City of Evans came together to help one other and the result is that many children will stay warm this winter."

The fundraising effort began with a public service breakfast at the Greeley/Evans Moose Lodge. Evans Police Officers served breakfast to the public with 100% of the proceeds going towards coats for kids. Evans PD FOP Lodge 64 purchased the coats at Sam's Club, along with gloves and hats from various stores throughout the Greeley/Evans community.

"For some families, it comes down to, do we eat or buy our kid a coat," Brandt said. "Hopefully, this event alleviates that burden for those families."

The coat drive was a collective effort between the Evans PD, the Greeley/Evans Moose Lodge, and Evans PD FOP Lodge 64.

Prescription Drug Take Back is a program focused on providing convenient locations for the public to drop off excess, unused and expired controlled substances and other medications. Start rounding up those meds for safe disposal on October 27.

Community Inspires Development of 34th Street Park

A beautiful, new park is taking shape at 34th street and 15th Avenue. The City of Evans has begun construction on a new, passive park. Longtime Evans' residents will remember that location as the old Municipal Pool.



The new park will feature a variety of amenities:

- Wooden Shade Trellis
- Passive Recreation Turf Areas
- Meandering Loop Trail
- Off-Street Parking Area
- Possible Future Restroom Building
- Possible Future Playground
- Additional Trees and Screening



Construction Begins!

For years, the Evans Municipal pool was a mainstay at the corner of 34th & 15th Avenue, but soon a brand new park will call that location home after a community-led effort inspired the new development.

"As we were determining what would go into this site, we held a couple of community meetings with the neighborhoods to figure out what they wanted," Brian Stone, Evans Recreation Director said.

Construction on the the new, passive park began in September and will feature a variety of amenities, including a walking trail and pergola.

"It really is their park and we wanted to make sure we brought something to their neighborhood that they would use."

"We hope to add things in the future, but right now it's a trail system where kids can get dropped off for the bus stop or ride their bikes and do different things at this location."

With the addition of 34th Street Park, the City of Evans is now home to 13 parks scattered throughout the city. Historic Riverside Park on the east side of town will hold its grand re-opening on October 27th. The park has not been in use since the flood of 2013 ravaged the area adjacent to the South Platte River.

"It really has kind of grown here in the last couple of years," Stone said. "This addition to the neighborhood really does start to create some excitement here for the City of Evans."



How many photos can one person enter?

What are the dates of the contest?

Photos will be accepted between March 1 and November 1, 2018.

All photos must be taken during that timeframe and taken within Evans City limits.

Winners will be announced at a reception in early December at the Riverside Library and Cultural Center.

All first and second place winners in each category will be on display following the announcement reception.

The display will remain up in the Riverside Library through January 31, 2019.

How do I submit photos?

What file formats will be accepted?

JPEG images will be the only format accepted for electronic submissions. The judging committee will determine size of printed image to be displayed based on best resolution.

What other rules are there?

Only images taken during the designated contest timeframe will be accepted.

Color or black & white images will be accepted.

All images need to have been taken in the City of Evans.

All images need to be appropriate in nature.

Photos will not be returned.

No selfies will be accepted.

All entries must be submitted with the entrants last name, first name and category for consideration.

(e.g. Doe, John, Water) In the case of multiple submissions in the same category, label the photos with last name, first name, category and number of entry. (e.g. Doe, John, Water 1; Doe, John, Water 2).

No tinted, pre-set, action or sepia images will be accepted.

No composite photos will be accepted.

All electronic submissions need to be submitted to info@evanscolorado.gov

Intellectual Property

Entry to the contest automatically gives the City of Evans permission to use entered photographs, along with your name and where the photo was taken in future publications, on their website, Facebook, Twitter and other social media venues, marketing and visual displays.

Are there prizes?

Yes! Each category will have a first and second place. Each second place will receive a ribbon and a certificate and every first place will receive a ribbon, certificate and a cash prize of \$100 for each adult category winner and \$50 for each youth category winner. Adult best of show will receive a \$250 cash prize and youth best of show will receive a \$125 cash prize.
