UPCOMING BALLOT MEASURE

Evans is a proud city with a family-like atmosphere. We're the type of community that waves to our neighbors and helps those in need. Our residents are connected by our neighborhoods, schools, employers, and streets.

The City of Evans is proud of the progress we're making to improve roads city-wide, but we have much more work to do. Current funding is not sufficient to keep up with declining road conditions, and it could take decades to widen all major thoroughfares.

That's why the Evans City Council has voted to place a one-percent sales tax measure on the upcoming municipal election ballot to exclusively fund road improvements.



Municipal Election Day: Tuesday, April 7, 2020 

About the proposed increase:

- A 1% increase will raise Evans' sales and use tax rate from 3.5% to 4.5%
- If passed, the City will collect approximately \$3 million in additional revenue
- This money would be used exclusively for road maintenance and widening
- The investment would be similar to a special tax shoppers are already paying in Greeley to fix Greeley's roads.

Why vote YES? ✓

- If passed, the City's road maintenance budget will triple, allowing many more roads to be resurfaced and dirt roads to be paved.
- Major roads will be widened on a faster timeline. The following road segments are the City's top priorities for arterial expansion:
 - 47th Avenue from 37th Street north
 - 37th Street from 35th Avenue west to Two Rivers Parkway
 - 65th Avenue from 37th Street south to 49th Street
 - 35th Avenue from Prairie View Drive south to 49th Street

Why vote NO? ✗

- If passed, a 1% sales tax will be placed on all purchases made in Evans by visitors and residents.
- There will be an uptick in construction as a result of the city's improved maintenance.



PRÓXIMA PROPUESTA ELECTORAL

Evans es una ciudad que se enorgullece de su atmosfera familiar. Somos el tipo de comunidad que todavía saluda a sus vecinos y quienes brindan ayuda a los necesitados. Nuestros habitantes están unidos a través de nuestros vecindarios, nuestras escuelas, nuestros empleos y nuestras calles.

Es por esta razón que el Consejo de la Ciudad de Evans ha votado para que la próxima papeleta electoral municipal incluya una propuesta para aumentar por uno por ciento los impuestos de ventas para exclusivamente financiar las mejoras de las calles.



¿QUÉ SIGNIFICA ESTO PARA MÍ?

Día de Elección Municipal: Martes 7 de Abril del 2020



Información acerca de la Propuesta de Aumentar el Impuesto de Ventas:

- El aumento del 1% incrementará la tarifa de impuestos sobre las ventas y uso en Evans del 3.5% al 4.5
- Si se aprueba, la Ciudad recaudará aproximadamente \$3 millones de ingresos adicionales
- Este dinero se usará exclusivamente para mantenimiento y ampliación de las calles
- La inversión sería semejante al impuesto especial que los residentes de Greeley ya están pagando en Greeley para componer las calles de Greeley.

¿Por qué Votar a FAVOR?

- Si la propuesta es aprobada, el presupuesto para el mantenimiento de las calles se triplicará, lo que facilitará el revestimiento de las calles y que las calles de terracería sean pavimentadas.
- Las calles principales serán ampliadas a un plazo más rápido.
- Las siguientes arterias de calles son prioridad para la expansión de vías principales de la Ciudad:
 - Avenida 47 del norte de la Calle 37
 - Calle 37 del oeste de la Avenida 35 hacia el camino Two Rivers Parkway
 - Avenida 65 del sur de la Calle 37 a la Calle 49
 - Avenida 35 del sur de Prairie View Drive a la Calle 49

¿Por qué Votar en Contra?

- Si se aprueba, se aumentará el impuesto sobre ventas de 1% en todas las compras hechas por visitantes y residentes en Evans.
- Habrará un estancamiento en construcción como resultado de las mejoras en el mantenimiento de la ciudad.



1% ROAD CONSTRUCTION FUNDING


The Evans City Council has placed a 1% sales tax measure on the April ballot to provide residents better road maintenance, and widen arterial roads and pave dirt roads. The measure will raise an additional \$3 million each year exclusively for road improvements.

Where to vote in Evans?

April 2020's election will be a mail ballot election. Residents can either place the ballot in a mailbox or bring it to the Evans Community Complex where there will be a ballot box both outside and inside at Customer Service desk.

When are our elections?

Election day is April 7, 2020 – we will be open and accepting ballots from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM

Can you vote online?

No, we can only accept the official ballots that are mailed, you can't email or fax the ballot either.

What you need to register to vote?

The Weld County Clerk and Recorder maintains voting records. If you have questions about your voter status or need more information about registering to vote, please call the Weld County Clerk and Recorder's Election Division at (970) 304-6525. You must meet the following requirements to register to vote:

Be a United States Citizen;

Be 18 years old on or before the date of the election; and
Reside in Colorado and at your present address at least 22 days before the election.

Winter Driving Information

We haven't made it out of winter just yet and it's as important as ever to be safe and be prepared when driving in icy, low-visibility conditions.

In snowy weather give yourself extra time to get where you're going, keep a larger distance than normal between yourself and the car in front of you, and perhaps most importantly: stay off your cell phone!

"Distracted driving is, I believe, the number one cause of accidents," says Evans Police Officer Bruce Williams. "Put your cell phones down when there's adverse weather."

To keep in the know of how Evans operates during snow storms, be sure to take a look at the City's "Snow and Ice Plan" and "Snow Clearing Plan" at www.evanscolorado.gov. You can also be proactive with reporting hazardous sidewalk conditions by calling Evans Code Enforcement at (970) 475-1115.

Free Mulch Available to Evans Residents By Appointment

Each year the City of Evans has a Christmas tree recycling station at the Community Complex where residents may drop off their tree once the holidays are over. The City then takes those trees and turns them into mulch that can be given to residents free of charge. Residents, if your significant other's been bugging you to clean up the yard, the Spring Cleanup's a great way to dispose of unwanted waste while earning brownie points. The bi-annual event takes its turn in the spring for two weekends in April. The event will be held on April 11th & 12th and the 18th & 19th, from 8am-4pm at 3323 1st Ave | Evans, CO 80620.



WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

All residents of the City of Evans, Colorado. Evans utility customers who pay for their trash service through their bill will receive vouchers via mail.

WHAT YOU NEED TO BRING

Bring the free cleanup voucher attached to the bottom of the letter you received in the mail. You will also be required to present proof of residency in the form of a driver license or Evans utility bill verifying your address.

CAN I BRING TIRES?

Waste tires will be accepted for an additional fee of \$2 per passenger vehicle tire without a wheel. All other tires will cost more. The second lowest fee will be \$7 for passenger vehicle tires with wheels.

WHERE DO I GET VOUCHERS?

Residents should have received one voucher in the mail with their utilities bill. Residents may purchase additional vouchers at the event with proof of residency for \$10 per load (cash only). You may also buy additional vouchers at the Evans Community Complex during normal business hours (Monday-Friday, 7:30 AM-5:00 PM). Trailers and loads larger than one pickup bed will require multiple vouchers.

WHAT ITEMS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED?

Weld County recycling guides will be available at the event or from the City by request. The guide will help residents determine what items will not be accepted at the cleanup. Examples include: electronics, refrigerants, and household hazardous wastes such as paint, cleaning chemicals, and a variety of other items that require special disposal.



The Evans Police Department is pleased to announce our 2020 Citizens Police Academy.

The nine-week academy will run March 19 through May 14, 2020, with most classes held on Thursday evenings from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM. This year, we've added a half-day at the range (Saturday May 9 from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM).

The Citizens Police Academy promotes community partnerships and is designed to familiarize individuals with the day-to-day operations of the police department. Participants will attend lectures on topics such as crime scene investigations, traffic enforcement, accident investigation, SWAT, narcotics, firearms, and less lethal force.

The program is free of charge. Seating is limited to 25 participants and you must be at least 18 years of age to participate. A background check will be completed on applicants prior to acceptance. Applications can be obtained at the Evans Police Department front desk during regular business hours, Monday through Friday between 8:00 AM and 5:00 PM, or by contacting Officer Teresa McClatchey at 970-590-1504 or email at tmclatchey@evanscolorado.gov.

Application deadline is March 6, 2020.





KIDS STREET REPORT RECAPS

Throughout February, Evans TV continued with its weekly Kids Street Report segment and we've got a rundown on all of the recent Evans happenings courtesy of our intrepid up-and-coming local reporters:

In Episode 4, Jaden Waller from Prairie Heights Middle School told us about:

The completion of the Fire Hydrant Project, which removed and replaced six fire hydrants throughout the City. The project also involved an upgrade to



certain ADA ramps in town.

The striping of newly chip-sealed roadways in the City will continue throughout the year, and new bike lanes will be installed on Harbor Lane which will create a network of bike paths connecting three city parks and neighborhoods with commercial centers.



The Atmos Energy Project, which is a pipe replacement project affecting around 22 residents. The project entailed replacing natural gas mains and service lines in the area.




"Effective public officials are among our greatest allies in efforts to fulfill our mission," said Ms. Whinery, responding to Mayor Rudy's proclamation.

2020 Census will be crucial for Evans and Weld County

Why It Matters

Hospitals. Fire departments. Schools. Even roads and highways. The census can shape many different aspects of your community. Each year, the results help determine how more than \$675 billion in federal funding is distributed to states and communities. It's also mandated by the Constitution: The U.S. has counted its population every 10 years since 1790.

What to Expect in 2020

By April 2020, households will receive an invitation to participate in the census. You'll then have three options to respond: online, by phone, or by mail. We'll mark Census Day on April 1, 2020, with events across the country. This is a key date for the 2020 count: When completing the census, you'll note where you are living on April 1.

Am I Required to Respond to the Census?

Yes, all people living in the United States, Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Guam, and the U.S. Virgin Islands are required by law to be counted in the 2020 Census.

Why It's Required

Getting a complete and accurate census count is critically important. That's why your response is required by law. If you do not respond, the U.S. Census Bureau will follow up in person to collect the information.

Why is the census so important? The results are used to determine how many seats your state gets in Congress. State and local officials also use census counts to draw boundaries for congressional districts, state legislative districts, and school districts.

And just as you are required by law to participate, the Census Bureau is bound by law to protect your answers. Your responses are used only to produce statistics. The Census Bureau does not disclose any personal information.

Starting in 2019, you may begin to notice census takers in your neighborhood. This is a normal part of the 2020 Census preparation and data collection process. Census field representatives will also continue to collect information for the American Community Survey (ACS) and other ongoing surveys.




